Next Week's Speaker/Program Preview - Jeremy Brimhall

Jeremy Brimhall describes himself as "a passionate advocate for arts education and a tireless supporter of the search for new ways to engage young audiences through classic art." Prior to serving as Director of Education and Community Engagement for

the Austin Symphony, Jeremy held similar posts for over a decade with the San Antonio Symphony and San Antonio Philharmonic, and previously performed as a musician of the State of Mexico Symphony Orchestra in Toluca, Mexico, where he resided for six years. Having married into a Mexican family and being in the process of raising two bilingual boys in Central Texas, Brimhall has a keen interest in the layered social dynamics that intersect Mexican, Mexican-American, other Hispanic and non-Hispanic groups in the Southwest, and how music can bring everyone together.

Here's a little about Sofia (from her member application): Sofia is a University of Texas graduate with a history of nonprofit service. She serves as the Member and Donor Relation Manager for the LBJ Foundation, working on strengthening community involvement and promoting the LBJ legacy through public programming aimed at addressing the issues of our times. She previously served as a Program and Association Partnership Coordinator for Strategic Association Management (SAM), where she provided comprehensive support to multiple nonprofits and associations.

Here's a little about Matthew (from his member application): My name is Matthew Peterson. I was born in North Carolina. My father was in the military, so I grew up in various locations in the United States and overseas. I graduated from high school in Georgia and immediately joined the military myself. After four years on active duty, I was honorably discharged and enrolled in college at New Mexico State University where I earned degrees in Government and Philosophy. Upon graduation, I returned to the military and earned a commission. For the next 17 years, I received assignments to various locations throughout the United States and overseas until I retired in 2019. While on active duty, I earned a Master of Arts in Organizational Leadership from Gonzaga University, and a Master of Science in Political Science from Liberty University.

After leaving the military, my first job was as the director of a ranch northwest of Austin. Next, I taught high school at a charter school in Austin. Working as a cowboy and as a teacher were childhood interests of mine, and I was grateful for the chance to experience those professions, but I knew neither would be my second career.

In July of 2021 I accepted an opportunity to work on behalf of veterans and seniors when I was confirmed as the Commandant of the lowa Veterans Home and the Interim Executive Director of the Iowa Department of Veterans Affairs. The Iowa Veterans Home is a continuing care retirement community. It is the fifth largest veterans home in the country and is home to over 400 residents. After a little more than a year there, I knew I wanted to return to Texas and that I had found my second career. After returning to Texas in September of 2022, I found an opportunity as the executive director of a memory care community in Temple, Texas where I served until reporting to Brookdale North Austin in March of 2025.

Here's a little about Ryan (from his member application):

How long have you lived in Austin? 7 years (previous locations include: Greensboro, NC, New York, New York, Charleston, SC, Winston-Salem, NC)

I enjoy movies, art, studying cities and urban planning, biking, hiking, recently getting into sailing and wanted to try windsurfing (once I heal from my shoulder injury).

I have been in Austin, Texas for 7 years now and want to be more engaged and connected to the community. I have always been involved with supporting non-profits and serving as a mentor. I have been involved with YMBL and volunteering for Austin Sunshine Camps for 2 years now. I have also expanded my role civically in my neighborhood, which has opened up my exposure to new challenges that our city faces. After getting to know Ronney, and learning about some of the projects and focus areas of this Rotary Club, it feels like a good outlet to dedicate time and energy.

What will be your contributions to the Rotary Club of Austin? The existing projects that I feel most aligned with are: Early Act First Knight, Literacy, Camp Enterprise and any providing an opportunity to serve as a mentor, especially with regard to promoting career paths/opportunities.

I am from a rural area and would like to engage in providing opportunities for those populations. I am entrepreneurial and creative and have a viewpoint with regard to solving issues such as housing and affordability. So I will bring a new voice/project ideas to the group.

I am a very civically engaged individual. I have led citywide engagement efforts in both Greensboro, NC and here in Austin (i.e. advocacy for pedestrian improvements such as a crosswalk at Lynn St and E Cesar Chavez St, new pickleball courts at Rosewood Park, alley revitalization and art projects in my neighborhood, etc.).

I also serve on the ECC Neighborhood contact team as a board member. In the past, I have worked on citywide initiatives involving public transit and public art, organized large fundraisers (one example is creating a HORSE basketball tournament fundraiser for an adult literacy organization in North Carolina called Reading Connections). I also served as a mentor at an entrepreneurship center in Greensboro, North Carolina for multiple years.

Most recently, I have been heavily involved in the Young Men's Business League (YMBL) serving two years on the organizational committee for the Austin Under 40 Awards, serving as the Sponsorship Chair for 2025. I am also the co-chair of the YMBL Speaker Series for 2025 and moderated our first event featuring renowned local architect and past AU40 winner, Juan Miro.
