

Rotarians are mobilizing "Little Communities That Could" create proficient readers




More than half the students in Minnesota's k-12 classrooms can't read proficiently. That's 500,000 kids-enough to fill the US Bank stadium 7.5 times. The consequences of not reading proficiently are catastrophic, not just for that child, but for their family, community and the economic engine of our state. While the problem crosses the socioeconomic strata of our state, it disproportionately affects those living in pockets of poverty, communities of Black, Indigenous and People of Color and children with different learning abilities. Minnesota's racial opportunity gaps are second worst in the country. Mississippi does a superior job with a pittance of our social capital. Minnesota can certainly do better. Rotarians are rallying to make it happen.

Rotarians Monica Martin from Monticello and Hyon Kim from Roseville have the mindset of "The Little Engine That Could." They aspire to mobilize their community so every child learns to read proficiently. These Rotarians helped ignite a statewide campaign and inspired "*Minnesota's Rally to Read*" *BHAG* (Big Hairy Audacious Goal): transform Minnesota to the state with the highest reading proficiency with the fewest inequities and accomplish it with a "fierce urgency of now."
