Now is the time to take action and ensure our club receives the recognition it deserves!





Is your Rotary club ready to start a Rotary Reader program?



Over two decades ago, the River Falls Rotary Club in River Falls, Wisconsin started their Rotary Reader program. It was the brainchild of then president, Tom Westerhaus, who worked closely with the reading specialist at Westside Elementary School, to establish a program where Rotarians would help students who may be struggling with their reading skills. Rotarians were asked to participate in a one-on-one reading program with students at Westside Elementary. Rotarians who volunteered were matched with a specific classroom teacher, and the teacher then would choose which students would benefit from additional reading help. The day of the week and times were mutually agreed upon by the teacher and Rotarian volunteer. Read More
