In the Rotary calendar, September is Basic Education and Literacy Month. Having a good ability to read is required to be successful in today's world. Without a good education, most doors are closed.

Many clubs have projects that address these needs. Some clubs still do a Dictionary Project. If not dictionaries, other types of books are given to young students. In some cases, these are the first books these children receive. In many communities, Rotarians give their time to help young readers improve their skills. Not all adults are proficient readers. There are clubs that work to help these people improve their abilities. If you presently have projects in this area, thank you. If your club does not, this would be a good time to plan a project.

Financial literacy is a needed skill for young adults. Many of them lack skills required to manage their finances and understand credit. A few clubs have programs to help these people. However, there are opportunities for more effort in this area.


Often, clubs support education by providing scholarships. Sometimes these are given to the best students in their community. Other times, scholarships are used to motivate and improve the education of struggling students, such as with the STRIVE program.

Then there are the international projects impacting education. Schools are built, dormitories constructed for teachers, clean water and restrooms provided, and books purchased for schools, to name a few efforts made by clubs in our District.



By partnering with Salesforce, a best-in-class technology solution, the new Membership Leads Management System will allow prospective members to take the lead. When someone shows interest in joining Rotary, they will be able to view available clubs, learn about meeting schedules, and select the club that best fits their interests and lifestyle.

At the same time, now is the season to begin recruiting for outbound students for the **2026–27 Rotary Youth Exchange**. Applications are due by **November 15, 2025**. *Link*.
