

 - 3. Items are listed in the top row of the spreadsheet.
- 4. Select the available dates (listed in the first column) that coordinate with your event remember to allow time for delivery and returning items.
 - 5. Select the items that you wish to borrow.
 - 6. Enter the information in the coordinating row (such as event date and time, club, etc.)
 - 7. Schedule delivery (and return) with your Assistant Governor.
