It is putting into practice a regenerative, permaculture-inspired design that weaves together USDA certified organic market gardening, food forests, land regeneration and re-wilding, and is a demonstration site for these approaches. Gateway Farm is a place of abundance and beauty; a community hub offering nutrient dense food, education, events, sanctuary, and hope for the future.

Program: June Kirchgatter introduced our speakers, Bridget O'Brien and Dr. Charlie Brennan, operators of Gateway Farm (www.gatewayfarmplymouth.com), the regenerative farming and permaculture project west of town at the corner of Joy and Ann Arbor Roads. O'Brien and Brennan opened with an acknowledgement of the Anishinaabeg and other indigenous people on whose land we now live. Gateway Farm raises its own crops and offers agricultural goods from other producers. Look on their Facebook page and their website to see the kinds of organic vegetables, even foods like elderberries, honey and coffee they offer for sale, in addition to providing classes, volunteer opportunities and children's activities. Bridget and Charlie also have a development and consulting firm, Garden Juju Collective (www.gardenjujucollective.com), that offers design services and workshops for permaculture. Gateway Farm is funded locally by Plymouth Orchard's Mary Emmett.
