Grace attended school (Kwassui High School) during her year in Japan. Schooling there is more structured with fewer electives. The school is also religious based. The language barrier took some time to adapt to but Grace enjoyed the challenge.

Grace had the opportunity to travel to Hokaido Island; Nagasaki; a basketball tourney; and meet monthly with other exchange students. The school had a mandatory 'Culture Day' and among the

activities Grace got to shoot archery.

Exchange has allowed Grace to be more confident and articulate. She has learned to speak up for herself. To say 'Yes' more! To set strong boundaries for herself! And one of lives lessons- It is OK not to be perfect!

Why did Grace decide to Exchange? She realized staying home would limit her. She wanted to learn a new language. Now she is reconsidering her college path with her new perspective.

Grace spoke eloquently and with confidence.
