Today's Featured Speaker – Attorney Angela Ghannam. Angela has been a licensed attorney in the State of Michigan since 2009. She is a graduate of the University of Detroit Mercy, both undergrad and School of Law. Angela said the first goal in estate planning is establishing each client's goals, and educating them about different options, rather than trying to force a one size fits all solution. Getting your estate planning in order will help ease complications in the future, like going to Probate Court which is a legal and financial mess. Estate planning allows you, instead of the court, to oversee the distribution of your property. It's important to review your Estate Plan regularly to add assets and change terms and conditions for your property and family needs. This is especially important in a blended family situation or where you want to help provide funds for grandchildren or to prevent family members from claiming your assets after you leave. A will alone won't protect you from Probate so make sure you have an Estate Plan and that you keep it updated.

Chuck Lang added that the Plymouth Rotary Foundation is always looking for funds from estates to help supplement the Foundation's fundraising efforts each year.
