

### Program Presentation

Greta Bolhuis, AICP, Planning and Community Development Director for the City of Plymouth presented "What's Changing in the City of Plymouth's Master Land Use Plan". The revised land use plan responds to the many changes that have taken place since the last plan was adopted in 2018. Greta stated that the Master Plan is a long-term policy document and a framework for future development possibilities. She was clear that it is not a law nor zoning changes. Rather, it is used on future zoning decisions, guides capital improvements, and guides implementation action.

- Local businesses and jobs
- Neighborhood character
