
Call to Order:

Today's Presentation – "New Member Huddle"

Preston Gee gave a detailed presentation on the various events, functions and major operations of the Plymouth Rotary Club. While many of these are well-known to senior members, it was a good update for new members and a welcome refresher for us all! Here's a rundown of what Preston touched on:

- Club Stats: We have 37 new members since the membership committee started formally meeting in 2023. The average age is 58. 20 new members in the past year. 50 new members in the past 5 years. 25 members have been with us for more than 25 years.
- **Golf Outing:** Proceeds go to Club account, then to Plymouth Rotary Foundation. About \$30,000 raised annually.
- Art in the Park: Proceeds go to Club account. Volunteers direct patrons to parking spots and collect a fee.
- Chicken BBQ: Proceeds go to Club account, then to Plymouth Rotary Foundation. About \$30,000 raised annually. Preston outlined the various

volunteer opportunities available for the days up to and including the day of the event.

- The Rotary Foundation: The International Rotary 501(c)(3) supporting Rotary programs and initiatives around the world. A \$1,000 donation to the Foundation recognizes you as a Paul Harris Fellow, which can be donated more than once.
- The Plymouth Rotary Foundation: Our local Plymouth Rotary 501(c)(3) which is governed by a board of directors elected by Club members. The Foundation basically funds most of our external programs, scholarships, and donations. Members can donate \$1,000 to become a Walter Panse Fellow.
- Walter Panse Gifts: Members are encouraged to donate to the Plymouth Rotary Foundation by making a gift for their birthday or special life event.
- The Collection Box, 50/50 Raffle, and Sargent at Arms: These activities help collect small dollar amounts that really add up by the end of the year (upwards of \$2,000). That money also goes to the Plymouth Rotary Foundation.

Wrapping things up, the 50/50 was won by **Denise King** for \$61. **Penny Joy** would have walked home with \$120 but she didn't make the meeting.




Broadcaster January 17, 2025



Program - Northville's Forgotten Neighborhoods.

June Kirchgatter introduced today's speakers, Hugh Jordan, a Northville native and published author and Ellen Elliott, a Plymouth icon, author, who also volunteers at the Northville Historical Society. Ellen, Hugh and Paul were all contributors to the book. The title of the book is "A Ride Through Northville" and is available at the Northville Historical Society.

Hugh's vision was to write about Northville's Forgotten Neighborhoods starting with some of the demolished homes which included a history of who lived there and interviews with descendents when possible.

Ellen and Hugh described the process they used to approach this project. In short, they divided Northville into five distinct areas and provided a brief history of each of the areas.

The areas included **Beal Town and Surrounds**, **Orchard Heights and Surrounds**, **Buchner Hill and Surrounds**, **Cabbage Town and Surrounds** and the **Business District**. The presentation includes photos from each area as well as a bit of history. The presentation also included a segment on **Millrace Village**.

Their next project will be a "History of Maybury Sanitorium".
