# Broadcaster July 25, 2025

Liz Orbits delivered the meditation and began with urging us all to consider the contributions of Rotarians who are no longer with us, including Alex Kramer who died in 2024 and was a strong advocate for surrogacy and was a member of the Michigan Fertility Alliance. Liz encourage us to pay tribute to the fellow Rotarians around the world who advocate,

nourish, educate and make connections throughout the world all to lift communities and improve the lives of others.

**Host Families** President **Candice** urged members or other interested families to consider hosting an exchange student in the upcoming year.

**Guests** Today's guests included **Jonathon Wennstrom**, past Livonia Rotary President, Livonia Elementary principal and Plymouth resident, our speaker, **Stephanie Jones**, **and Debbie Ley**, whose daughter has gone through several organ replacements and is still hopeful to be able to utilize the services of the Michigan Fertility Alliance. Candice led us in a new and interesting version of "Hello" but there is still much work to be done.

**Birthdays** The last birthday celebrant this month is **Richard Cherney** who was not present today. Fortunately for him he didn't have to experience an attempt at "Happy Birthday."

Announcements Penny Joy filled us in on the upcoming trip to Ghana and provided us with a list of items for distribution in Ghana. Michelle Hall, who will also be going to Ghana received a donation of three Tigers tickets toward materials to be purchased for Ghana. June Kirchgatter, served as an auctioneer for sale of the tickets and enticed Kirk Sivic to purchase the tickets for \$225. Thank you, Kirk.

Program – Liz Orbits introduced our speaker, Stephanie Jones - The Michigan Fertility Alliance was founded in 2019. Much of their work is focused on policy reform and implementation. Stephanie explained that 1 in 6 people of fertility age in Michigan have infertility issues with 47% being males. Stephanie explained the various fertility treatments including Ovulation Inducement, Intrauterine Insemination (IUI), In Vitro Fertilization (IVF) and Surrogacy. She stated that over 100,000 children per year in the U.S are born through fertility treatments.

A perplexing problem through the years was the legal relationship between

a parent and their child. Prior to the Alliance sponsored Michigan Family Protection Act there were many blurred lines regarding children born through fertility treatments Ther parental Rights and Responsibilities are now clearly defined as a result of the passage of the act.

The Alliance will be hosting An Autumn Soiree "In Good Spirits" on Saturday, October 18 from 4:30 -7:00 pm at Chicane. Check out their website for additional information.

She presented data about our club, our membership, our finances and more!


The 50/50 winner was Don (Soenen?). Second chance was- not here!
