First Step - Don Soenen introduced The First Step Executive Director, **Lori Kitchen-Buschel**. Lori began her presentation by thanking Rotary for our continued support, both financially and by providing "sweat equity" in helping to provide the park where program participants can find safe and comfortable surroundings during the time they are receiving services. First Step, whose 55 staff members provide free services to those impacted by Domestic Violence and Sexual Assault. The services provided include the following:

- 24 -hour helpline
- · 24-hour on call assault response
- · Emergency shelter for individuals, families and their pets
- · Transitional support housing
- Counseling, advocacy and support groups for adults and children
- · Support and educations for family and friends
- Safety planning
- Criminal Court advocacy
- Personal Protection Order assistance
- · Community education and outreach programs
- In-service training on domestic violence, sexual assault and stalking
- Legal, financial, medical and housing information and referrals

As you can see from the above, the services provided by First Step are most extensive. Last year alone they touched the lives of just under 9000 individuals.

Friends of the Rouge

Don Soenen introduced The Fiends of the Rouge Executive Director, Marie McCormick. Marie provided us with detailed information as well as current and planned initiatives to help to grow a healthier Rouge River. Marie emphasized the importance of being all inclusive regarding gathering input from all the communities and community members in the Rouge Watershed. Marie provided information of the many Restoration Progams and the impact they have had on the watershed. It should be noted that our own Rotary Club donated \$10,000 towards the Rain Gardens in the PARC parking lot. **Don Soenen** was able to secure an additional \$400,000 to assist with this project. On numerous occasions staff members and volunteers help to monitor the stream conditions by doing bug hunts, frog and toad surveys, fish monitoring and stonefly research. Some interesting facts about the Rouge Watershed are that it encompasses 467 square miles in Wayne, Oakland and Washtenaw counties. There are four major branches with 126 river miles. There are approximately 1.35-1.5 million people living in the watershed area. This was a most interesting presentation and I would encourage Rotarians to go to plymoputhrotary.org and click on the face book icon and watch Marie's presentation in its entirety.
