Today's program was presented by **Juli Harding**, Asst. Governor for Area 5. Her topic was **"Strengthening Rotary through Brand Consistency."**

Juli shared that she is a former 8th grade teacher and a new grandmother. She began by having everyone find their "match" based on cards she passed out. Partners were asked to tell their own story of how/why they came to Rotary.

This led into her talk about how Rotary's impact is increased by consistent branding.

Using the same imagery and language to enhance the Rotary brand has four benefits. It solidifies identity, differentiates Rotary from others, increases credibility, and creates stronger connections with media.



and delivering messages that let people know who we are and what we do. Juli urges us to be aware of all the platforms where people learn about us. It is important that we are consistent. How we communicate shapes public perceptions. The Rotary Brand Center provides tools including ready-to-use tools, templates, logos, video and images, as well as key messages.

Her recommendations:

- Form a Branding Team (with members who know marketing, PR, and social media)
- Address public misconceptions (Rotary is not what you think)
- Review and update all branding materials
- Leverage the Brand Center
- Craft compelling stories
- Create a content calendar
- Measure results

Call to Order The meeting began somewhat differently than in the past as we began lunch prior to the meeting being called to order in order for us to watch two videos regarding the upcoming "The Sun Never Sets on Rotary " meeting which will be held on Sunday, February 23 at 11:am.. The two videos which we watched were entitled "The Sun Never Sets on Rotary" which explained the purpose of the 24 hour meeting. The other Video was "Celebrating 120 Years of Rotary".

Following the viewing of the videos, President **James Gietzen** called the meeting to order and then led us in the Pledge of Allegiance. President **James** then welcomed the Rotary Clubs throughout the world to our meeting. James then showed a video from Rotary International President, **Stephanie A. Urchick,** Rotary International President, who gave greetings and a brief summary of the workings of Rotary International.

Chris Porman, Past Plymouth Rotary President, welcomed the World Wide Rotary Club members to the Plymouth Rotary and to District 6400 which includes clubs from Southwest Ontario and Southeast Michigan. Chris talked about the many contributions that our club has made, including the \$200,000 grant to the PCEP Radio station. 88.1, the \$15,000 grant to the Miracle League of Plymouth to upgrade their facilities, the generous contributions for upgrades to Rotary playgrounds, as well as the thousands of dollars for scholarships. Chris also described many of the community based contributions made by other clubs including our neighbors in Ontario. Program-Red Cross

David Williamson introduced today's speakers, **Diane Risko**, Blood Drive Coordinator, **Carnel Richardson**, Disaster Program Manager, **LaToysa "Toy" Rooks**, Regional Disaster Officer.

Diane explained the importance and the value of giving blood and then showed a WDIV video featuring a young girl who needed transfusions every three weeks due to a genetic defect. Without these transfusions she couldn't begin to lead anything close to a normal life. **Diane** also stated that The Red Cross recently changed some
