The speakers today are members of the Michigan National Guard. First up was Sergeant First Class Todd Busch. He first asked the club how many components of the Army there are. Nothing but crickets... He then told us there are 3: Active Duty, Reserve and National Guard. The National Guard has its roots in the Minutemen of the Revolution. Therefore it is the oldest of the military services.

Sqt **Busch** is in charge of recruiting in a large portion of SE Michigan. He introduced Sgt Gabby Lynn as she is the local recruiter based out of Livonia covering PCEP, Canton, Westland and Wayne. Gabby is full time in the Guard. However, she is just returning to work after maternity leave. She is a graduate of Salem High. It is very competitive to be full time in the National Guard. She served in several positions in the Guard finally ending in human resources as a recruiter. Recruiting is a tough environment. However, they have been modestly successful in recruitment.

The State of Michigan invests \$14k in educating Guard members. This is a very strong support for our Guard. This is a benefit that the general population is unaware of.

Many of the recruits are people that don't complete college- they drop out. Then, if they are receptive, they consider the national guard as an avenue of service and of a career path. That path often includes financial support to gain their college degree.

Community Colleges are a strong resource for the National Guard. Sometimes they provide their student drop out lists to the Guard. Those people are approached and find a way forward with their education and a potential career path in the Guard.

Chris invited Denise King to the podium for an announcement about Noa our Belgian exchange student and tor 50/50 and second chance. Noa wants to join the alpine ski club but the fee is \$1500 plus the equipment required. He's willing to rake leaves to support this effort. Please reach out and support him.

The 50/50 was won by none other than Chris Porman! Second chance would have been Art Gulick but he wasn't here.


SERGEANT AT ARMS
