The 2022 Chicken BBQ Committee also made its final check presentation to the Club with a massive check totaling \$34,000. Great job everyone!

Following lunch our guest speaker was our own Plymouth Township Police Chief, James Knittel, who was introduced by Trustee Stewart. Chief Knittel explained the Township PD's new statewide accreditation. The Plymouth Township Police Department is now among fifty-three agencies accredited by the Michigan Law Enforcement Accreditation Commission. Only 9 Michigan townships have this accreditation. With 583 law enforcement agencies in the state, our accredited status places Plymouth Township in the top tier of law enforcement agencies, underscoring the professionalism and dedication of our Police and 911 Dispatchers. The three-year accreditation process involved the review and modification of departmental policies and practices to comply with hundreds of established accreditation standards. Our Police Department is now in line with current standards of excellence and industry best practices. To maintain accredited status, the Plymouth Township Police Department must continue to show proof of compliance to all standards annually. Congratulations to our Police!
