First of all, what is NID?

NID stands for National Immunization Days -- Rotary's continuing effort to eradicate polio in countries which still remain susceptible to the disease.

Since an oral vaccine is used, Rotarians are able to participate over a span of a few days in immunizing children under five years of age. As the program has been set up,

medical professionals are not required and volunteer opportunities exist for you to participate.

Past District Governor Steven Hopper volunteered for an NID in India in 2017 and he will share with anyone what a great impact giving just two drops of vaccine to children had on his life.

The district treasurer has an important role in the district and serving in that position is a great way to learn more about Rotary. Qualified candidates will have experience in bookkeeping using QuickBooks, be well organized and have good communication skills.

On average, the treasurer writes 70 checks per year, receives club dues mostly in July and August and district conference registration fees in October and November. The treasurer participates, when



available, on two committees that meet monthly, the District Meeting Council and the Youth Exchange Committee, and is a member of the District Administration and Finance Council that meets quarterly. The treasurer provides training to club treasurers at Spring Training.
