Michael Klitzing Updated the Club About Carmel's Award-winning Parks

Michael Klitzing, Director and CEO of Carmel Clay Parks & Recreation, addressed Carmel Rotarians on January 30th and shared information about Carmel's outstanding public parks, one of only 222 nationally accredited park systems. Carmel Clay Parks & Recreation has twice received the prestigious National Gold Medal for Excellence in Park and Recreation Management, the highest honor for any park and recreation system.

With over 5.7 million visitors annually, Klitzing said if Carmel's park system were a national park, it would be second only to the Great Smokey Mountains as the most visited park system, and ahead of Zion National Park in number of annual visitors. He highlighted Carmel park's growth and future plans and remarked that Carmel's parks' annual \$20 million operating budget is 80% funded by user fees and non-tax dollars and is recognized as one of the best and most innovative park and recreation agencies in the United States.

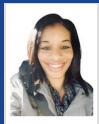

Christian Gray is awarded the 2026-2027 All-Indiana Global Grant

Scholarship

Indiana Rotary Districts 6540, 6560, and 6580 are proud to announce that Christian Gray was selected from a field of five candidates as the recipient of the 2026-2027 All-Indiana Global Grant Scholarship. This award is made annually for graduate level study at a university outside of North America. Eligible candidates must have graduated from a four-year college in Indiana or have legal residency in Indiana and present a plan of study and a career commitment that align with one of Rotary's seven areas of focus.



Growing up on the west side of Indianapolis, Christian developed a passion for community economic development watching the vibrancy of his neighborhood fade as businesses left the area. Today, those once vacant storefronts are home to markets, local mechanics, hair salons, and restaurants offering a variety of international cuisine. That renaissance happened when residents rose up to meet the needs of their community, aided with support from a non-profit comprised of community leaders, business owners, and neighbors.

Christian attended Wabash College where he earned a B.A. degree in Psychology in a program that included a study abroad segment at Vrije Universiteit in Amsterdam.

More recently, he deepened his community involvement by volunteering at the local MLK Center. Work there addresses peoples' wholistic needs that starts by breaking down basic barriers to education, food, and shelter and continues through offering them a palpable sense of community.

Christian will use the \$40,000 scholarship and return to Amsterdam this autumn to pursue a Masters in International Development Studies at Universiteit van Amsterdam. After completing a one-year graduate program, he plans to work for a non-profit organization in the Netherlands focused on community self-empowerment, developing and assisting with programs for basic literacy and financial independence.

Long-term, Christian's goal is to lead a non-profit organization that creates a network of communities working to solve challenges using resources they already possess. Ultimately, he wants to develop a knowledge base of successful solutions and common barriers that can be leveraged for use at both a grassroots and global level.

Susan E. Albrecht, Wabash College Fellowship Advisor, submitted an enthusiastic recommendation. Included in her letter she stated, "Armed with the support of Rotary and its network of individuals who are dedicated to addressing massive global needs such as peace and conflict resolution, maternal and child health, education, and economic and community development, Christian will be able to significantly expand the impact he would have been able to make without the network, the graduate degree, and the life experiences the Global Scholarship affords. I am excited to consider the possibilities of what he will do with all of this under his belt!"

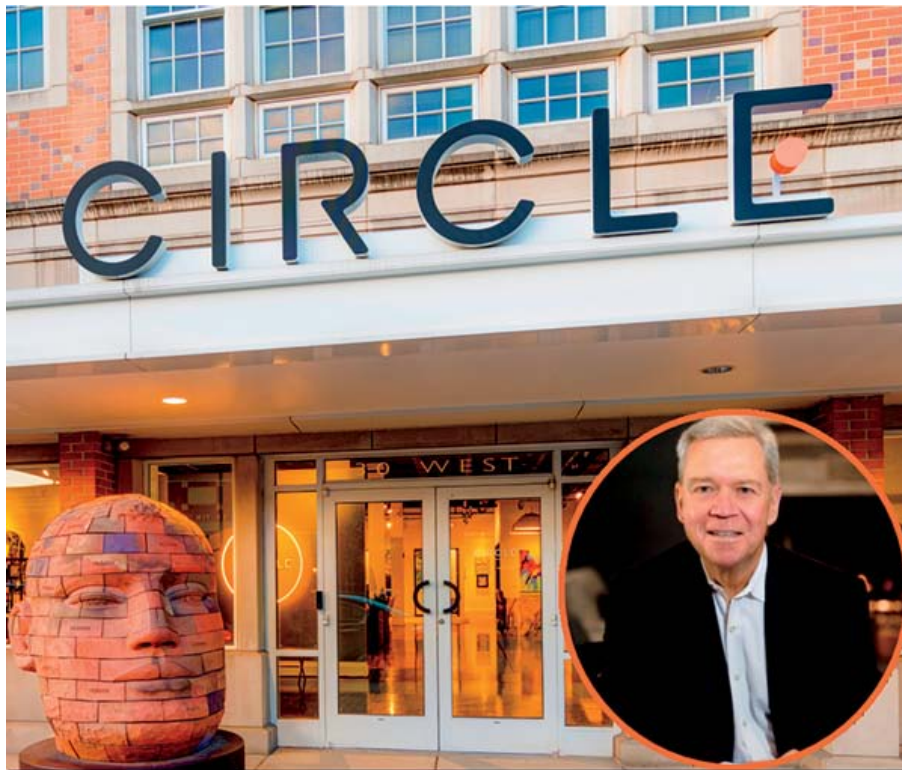
