The company currently has offices in San Carlos, CA, Santa Cruz and Marina, CA as well as Munich and D.C. The Dayton location will someday house manufacturing for the aircraft, but it might be years before that is happening here on a large scale

Joby has recently partnered with UAE/Dubai and has done test flights in Japan and South Korea.

Their aircraft are clean, quiet and emission-free and built from the ground up by the company.


