Karla Garrett Harshaw introduced Teresa Sanders, Interim CEO of YWCA Dayton, to speak on The Path Forward for the organization.

Teresa spoke about the journey of the YWCA Dayton, which began over 154 years ago with a mission to eliminate racism, empower women, and promote peace, justice, freedom and dignity for all. The organization provides services for those who may find themselves on the margins of society. The YWCA Dayton Plan Forward is to provide mission alignment and measurable momentum by developing strategic partnerships, communicating transparently, and investing in their people. Teresa encouraged partnership and participation from all.

After Teresa's formal talk, she began to tell the story. She cited 3,000 calls made to the Dayton PD in 2024 related to intimate partner violence, to

September 15, 2025 <u>Kimberly Luse</u> Fisher/Nightingale Houses Inc. which YWCA Dayton is the only lifeline for many of these victims. She spoke of the ROI recognized by YWCA services, reducing the burden on housing, healthcare and education systems. Teresa is excited about the commitment of the Dayton community, and to work within the community going forward.

Teresa took a number of questions from the group:

What does she see as future issues for the organization?

- · She thinks financial trauma is an under-recognized issue which she hopes to include in future programming.
- Connecting to other nonprofits and organizations in a more meaningful way going forward.
- · Collecting and using data effectively going forward in order to better share the story.

The YWCA facility is aging and costly, what is planned to address this?

- · Thinking differently about how YWCA raises money, but the ultimate goal is to get to sustainability first.
- YWCA USA is stepping up to bridge gaps in organizations, including real estate management.

What are current funding sources, and what can be captured going forward?

- · Current funding is mostly city, state and federal governments. YWCA USA has a consultant to help plan in development.
- Teresa recognizes they have to do a better job with individual giving, and recognizing those individuals.
- The Women of Influence event will be coming back to help in these efforts.

How do women that need help find their way to the YWCA?

- There is a 24-hour hotline for response at any time.
- Survivor networks and other nonprofits can serve to refer as well.

What programs exist to break the cycle with children?

- · YWCA Dayton has been weak in this area recently.
- The plan is to work on securing funding for Early Childhood Mental Health Consultation.

- Building children's components into shelter services

Is there a way to tell the stories of women who are, or who have been in the shelter without sacrificing privacy?

- · Stories are very powerful
- Aftercare and alumni groups exist within the organization. Some are well enough and ready enough to share their story, and will be included in Women of Influence event.

Linda thanked Teresa for speaking and attending on behalf of the group.


