- District 6670 currently has 47 clubs
- District membership is at 2,500 down from 3,000
- Dayton Rotary has 215 members
- Jennifer Jones is Rotary International's first woman president and her theme is IMAGINE ROTARY

DG Frank has four goals:

- **Membership** - 4 net members per club for a district total of 180 net new members
- **Foundation** - \$100/member/year - Use Rotary Direct at [www.my.rotary.org](http://www.my.rotary.org). There are 106 Paul Harris Fellows in the Dayton Club. And the Dayton Club has given \$686,000 to The Rotary Foundation over the years.
- **Public Image** - The district will focus on getting club news to the district using a social media campaign that includes Facebook, Twitter, LinkedIn, and Instagram. Reach out to Frank to volunteer at the district level.
- **Youth** - Rotary wants to award 100 two-year scholarships to Rotary's Peace Academies every year. Kelly Lehman is the chair of the Peace Fellows Interview Committee. Rotary receives 800 applicants per year to fill the 100 slots. Youth Exchange is up and running.

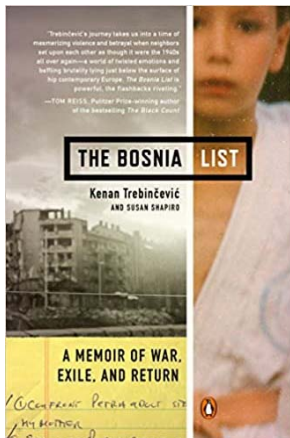
## Rotary Book Club

Our next book continues the theme, *The Bosnia List: A Memoir of War, Exile & Return* by Kenan Trebincevic, Susan Shapiro, et al.

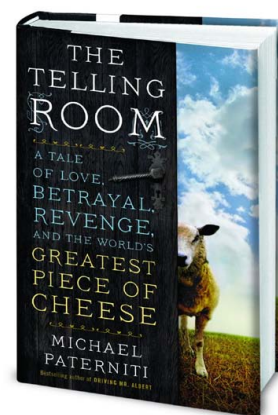
