"The DoD's Employer Support Committee – Vital Services for our Guard and Reserve Members"



John McCance is the state chairman for the Department of Defense's Employer Support of the Guard and Reserve committee. ESGR is a DoD activity that was established by Congress 53 years ago to strengthen the relationships between civilian employers and their employees that serve in the Guard and Reserve. The ESGR conducts employer outreach and informs military leadership and Guard and Reserve members of their rights and responsibilities under the governing Federal Law. It also provides an ombudsman for military members and employers when difficulties arise.

Ohio's ESGR Committee is made up of 37 Department of Defense volunteer employees supporting those 25K Reserve Component members in all 88 counties.

As the Chief Creative Officer at Dayton Live, Gary Minyard believes that participation in the arts is an essential component of every person's well-being. He has created many community-based arts initiatives including *Kites of Kindness*, *Superhero Girls Like Me, Radio Waves*, and *Guitars: A Bridge To* Broadway. Gary also expanded Dayton Live's Discovery Series to utilize each unique venue and designed customized resources to give 18,000 students a year more intimate performing arts experiences on field trips. He created the Miami Valley High School Theatre Awards (MVHSTAs), which is a Regional Awards Program for The Jimmy Awards® serving 39 local high school theatre programs. He introduced Sensory-Inclusive performances to Dayton Live, creating judgement-free spaces for people with autism, sensory sensitivities, or other social, learning, or cognitive disabilities. Gary also created the Dayton Live Creative Academy where thousands of students from all over the Miami Valley can participate in performing arts classes, camps, and intensives throughout the year. He also produces several shows at Dayton Live including the Unplugged Series in the PNC Arts Annex, the MVHSTA Showcase, and an annual holiday cabaret. Gary also writes and stars in "Behind The Scenes," a video series celebrating theatre facts, stories, and lore.

Gary is an award-winning director, designer, and movement/fight choreographer who graduated with an MFA in Theatre for Youth and Directing from Arizona State University. He studied at the University of Houston and trained at the L'Ecole Internationale de Théâtre Jacques Lecoq in Paris. He has also toured extensively as an actor, director, and teaching artist through 48 of our 50 states with many professional theatre companies.
