Linda shared that August 1st was the 113th Anniversary of Rotary Club of Dayton Charter.

This presentation offered an inside look at Levitt Pavilion Dayton and the power of free, public concerts to build a stronger, more vibrant community. We explored how live music and shared experiences are helping to transform downtown Dayton—drawing diverse crowds, boosting local businesses, and deepening the community connection.

As we look ahead to Summerfest, it's a great reminder of the bigger picture—and the big impact—we're all helping to create.

Levitt Pavilion Dayton is a standout example of the experience economy in action: free, high-quality cultural experiences that bring people downtown, spark emotional connections, and fuel local economic growth. It's more than entertainment—it's meaningful community investment and urban transformation.
