## This Happened Last Monday...

Linda introduced Shaun Yu who made several announcements about the December 12<sup>th</sup> meeting when the regular meeting agenda will be replaced with the annual Holiday Sweepstakes & Elections meeting. He reminded everyone to: purchase a \$50 ticket (additional tickets also available), bring an unwrapped gift with a minimum value of \$25, be ready to purchase 50/50 Raffle tickets and bid on silent auction items, and wear your ugliest holiday sweater. Shaun explained that all club members would receive an email so they can vote for club elections, regardless if they attend the December 12 meeting in-person or not. However, everyone was encouraged to attend in-person.

Rotarians offered the following Day-Tens and other foundation gifts. Gary Gottschlich pledged a Day-100 to Rotary International in celebration of Carolyn Rice. Chuck Watts pledged a Day-10 to announce the Old Time Dunbar family Christmas Celebration on December 16, 17, and 18. Carolyn Rice pledged a Day-146.50 (one dime for each vote she received) in honor of her winning her re-election campaign for Montgomery County Commissioner. She thanked everyone for being there for her. She received a standing ovation. Paul Gruner gave a Day-Ten for the new Bearcat Coach. Dave Williamson pledged a Day-50 for Carolyn Rice. Donna Childs pledged a Day-Ten for attending the meeting in-person for the first time

Walt Hibner, club president, welcomed everyone and introduced several new members. Chuck Watts came to the podium to introduce new member Anita Lewis. Walt introduced a new corporate membership, altafiber altafiber's members are: Jason Praeter, Eric Farrell, Dan Driskell, and Evan

Iris Juergens, foundation trustee, came to the podium to present a check to Graceworks Lutheran Services. Judi Budi and Tim Fischer accepted the award and thanked the foundation for their support of their project. They will be investing in therapeutic technology to assist with memory-care support. The technology is called "Torvertafel" or Technology to Reduce Dementia-Related Behavior.

Walt, Chair of the Day, introduced the Speaker of the Day, Jason Praeter, president and general manager of the Network Division of altafiber. Jason introduced himself and his connections to the Miami Valley. He explained "fiber" and how it connects people, businesses, and technology. Jason discussed the 150 year-old company, recently re-branded as altafiber (fka Cincinnati Bell), and their important milestones. The company stretches from Hawaii to Kentucky to Troy, Ohio. They were the first to roll out ASDL in North America, they merged with Hawaiian Telecom, they started laying fiber in 2008 and this month they will surpass 1 million homes. They currently have 2800 employees, 2800 tech certificates, 1,2 billion in revenue, ad 2500 clients. Jason also discussed how they are approaching digital equity, public-private partnerships, their smart city application, and how they give back to their communities. Several questions were asked about altafiber's local presence, their customer service philosophy, and areas that are still too isolated for fiber.

Jason then pulled a ticket from the fire hat, and the Queen of Hearts broke another heart when she refused to be pulled from the remaining 5 cards in the deck. There will be no Queen of Hearts pulled at the December 12 meeting.
