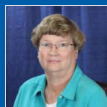

LAST MEETING - March 5 2026

ANNOUNCEMENTS:

- President Roush reminded members to review the Duty Roster and encouraged those who have not yet signed up for a weekly role to consider stepping in.
- The Golf Committee met on March 3 to kick off planning for this year's outing, which will take place on Friday, May 8, at the Marietta Country Club. ***If your business would like to contribute to the SWAG bags, please plan to provide items for 125 golfers.*** The committee is also accepting bottles of wine and liquor for the annual putting challenge.
- President Roush provided an overview of the board meeting held on March 4. Club financials remain strong and in line with the budget. This year's scholarship allowance has been set at \$20,000. The spring break program will be held on April 2 and will feature activities led by Discovery World. ***Lastly, effective April 1, the Lafayette will increase the cost of our meals from \$13 to \$15 per person.***

Program: Last week, we welcomed Justin Clark, CEO of the Boys & Girls Clubs of Washington County, and fellow Rotarian Andrew Parsons, Chief Development Officer, who shared an overview of the organization's recently announced merger with the Ely Chapman Education Foundation. The merger brings two long-standing youth organizations together under one umbrella to strengthen and expand services for children and families across Washington County. By combining leadership, resources, and donor support, the unified organization will be positioned to serve more youth while enhancing early learning, after-school programming, and family support services. Justin and Andrew emphasized that the merger was driven by opportunity rather than necessity and is intended to ensure long-term sustainability and expanded impact for local kids.
