PROGRAM

Chan Cochran introduced today's guest, Roger Geiger, Executive Director, of the Ohio Small Business Council. The Ohio Small Business Council is a part of the Ohio Chamber of Commerce. Its mission is to promote and protect the establishment, growth, and vitality of small businesses in Ohio. Mr. Geiger previously spent 20 years as vice president and executive director of Ohio for the National Federation of Independent Businesses. He had recently retired but then took on his current role.

Mr. Geiger shared several enlightening statistics about small business in Ohio. Ohio is home to 1 million small businesses. 99.6% of all businesses in Ohio employ 500 or fewer people. 96% have 25 or fewer employees. An additional almost 800,000 individuals are self-employed. 2.2 million of Ohio's 4.9 million employees are employed by small businesses (45%). 2 out of every 3 net new jobs created in the last decade have been created by small businesses. Women and minorities are the fastest-growing segment of creators of new small businesses. 75% of small businesses donate an average of 6% of their profits to charitable organizations annually.

1 in 4 small businesses fail in the first year and 45% fail within 5 years. However, 70% those that get past 5 years will close on their terms. 25 years ago, 75% of Americans wanted to own their own business. Today only 62% do, (however, 92% of young people today say they want to be their own boss.)

Mr. Geiger also shared some interesting results from the Ohio Small Business Council's 2025 survey. When listing what impacts their business the most, business owners said that the number one issue was the cost of healthcare and health insurance, with 76% of respondents identifying that issue. The next most important issue was finding quality employees (soft skills and work ethic), with 48% identifying this issue. Another 44% of respondents noted that uncertain economic conditions were a major issue, and the survey was done prior to the most recent tariff announcements).

Mr. Geiger noted that of the many issues facing small business owners, one major issue is the huge number of local taxing jurisdictions. Although Ohio is fairly "middle of the road" when it comes to state income taxes, Ohio is a complete morass when it comes to local taxes with over 6,000 local taxing jurisdictions, which is more than the state of New York.

Mr. Geiger then took a few questions from the audience.
