


Derby Diversity Week





Quarterly Contributions to the Rotary Fund and Rotary Foundation

Support of our local Rotary Fund of Louisville and the Rotary International Foundation grant-making organizations is a very important part of being a member of the Rotary Club of Louisville, and is the source of funds for our many service projects! To take advantage of lower processing fees available to tax-exempt organizations (the Fund is one, the Club is not), we are shifting from adding the contributions to Club dues invoices as we have done in the past - to setting up automatic recurring payments directly to the 501(c)3 Fund. This will save several hundred dollars in fees each year and be a much more efficient process, in addition to being more straightforward for tax purposes. The steps are very simple and do not have to be repeated once initially set up. If you prefer, we are happy to assist or do it for you.

I'm excited to announce a little incentive: each person who sets up an automatic recurring contribution to BOTH our local Rotary Fund of Louisville AND to the Rotary International Foundation (totaling \$100 or more per year for each) will have their name entered for a series of drawings. Winners will receive **Paul Harris Fellow recognition points**. Watch for a follow-up email with details.

JCPS Career Fair Survey




