Rotary Leadership Fellows Program

The Rotary Leadership Fellows Program celebrated two graduates and welcomed two new members at our meeting last week. The program originated in 1996 as the Landrum Prize for Leadership. In 2001, the Rotary Club of Louisville partnered with the Landrum Family to create a unique program designed to exercise the Club's mission of service, provide a three-year leadership development program, and create a pipeline of future leaders for the Club and the community at-large.

Fellows are recent or soon-to-be graduates of the University of Louisville MBA program. Each Fellow is matched with mentors, organizes three Fellows meetings, participates in Club meetings, service and social activities, and receives a \$5,000 cash award.

This year, **Matt Riggle** and **Taylor Davis** completed the Fellowship program. Taylor is a Relationship Manager with Lifetime Wealth Strategies. Matt is Vice President of Asphalt Materials and Analytics at Louisville Paving and Construction. Both Matt and Taylor will join the Club as full members.
