

This week's Meeting: Dr. John Hale / Archaeologist and Historian

Our featured speaker on Thursday will be **Dr. John Hale** - this is sure to be one of the most unique and fascinating presentations in 2022!



"Underwater Discoveries from King Herod's Harbor at Caesarea Maritima in Israel."

One of the most historic underwater sites on earth is the ancient harbor of Caesarea Maritima on the Mediterranean coast of Israel, where sunken structures and shipwrecks from Biblical times to the era of the crusaders can still be found and studied today. Archaeologist John Hale has spent many field seasons diving in the waters of Caesarea Harbor, working with an international team that has discovered ancient cargoes of bronze statues, gold and silver coins, and even swords and other weapons from the time of Richard the Lionheart of England and the Crusades.

Rotarian in the Spotlight: Whitney Austin

Rotarian **Whitney Austin** Founder & Executive Director of [Whitney/Strong](#) and mass shooting survivor, was in Washington DC to witness the historic passage of the Bipartisan Safer Communities Act.



Whitney was featured in the ***Washington Post***:

As the Senate entered the final throes of debate Thursday, moving toward the decisive 65-33 final vote, Whitney Austin, 41, watched from the gallery above the floor. Austin was shot 12 times in a September 2018 shooting inside the Cincinnati bank headquarters where she worked, playing dead on the lobby floor to survive, then spending months recovering in the hospital. Before she was released, she had started a nonprofit, Whitney/Strong, to advocate for compromise on gun laws, and among the first lawmakers the Louisville resident lobbied was McConnell: "I didn't get yes at the beginning, but I didn't give up."

As she walked up to the gallery Thursday, invited by McConnell's office, Austin said thoughts of failure ran through her mind: "Are you sure you have the votes? Is anyone going to change their mind? Am I being punked?" she said. "I've only been working actively for four years, but I've had enough very difficult conversations to believe that any moment it could all go wrong." Across the chamber she spotted Mark Barden, who had lost his son Daniel at Sandy Hook and founded his own advocacy group, and flashed him a heart sign. At one point Thursday evening, McConnell himself came up to the gallery and told Austin, "We're going to get it done." She gave him a hug.

"It can feel like you're banging your head against the wall, and I personally have had many moments where I think: Why am I doing this? This is never going to change," she said afterward. "But I didn't stop, and all those other people didn't stop, and we got here."
