A couple of important things this week:

1) Dues invoices for the 3rd quarter are being sent out this week and **action is required by every member**. To pay online, you must click on the "Review and pay" button in the email you get from Rotary with the subject line "New payment request from Rotary..." and input your debit/credit card or bank information. You are providing it via the Intuit Quickbooks payment platform with state-of-the-art encryption and authentication technologies including SSL, digital certificates and RSA encryption...it's as secure as you can get online.

You can still pay by check if preferred - please go ahead and do so in the next few days if possible. I'm happy to accept checks at the meetings or you can mail to the office.

2) We have quite a few members with **outstanding dues** from prior quarters - which you probably thought were paid via your card on file. I have only recently had time to review each account as part of our year-end reconciliation process, or you would have been notified more timely. 
# Last Week's Meeting Recap : Greg Gitschier, Former Secret Service Agent

# 'This is the start'



#### In Kentucky, newly passed federal gun law met with cautious optimism

"In many ways, this is more of a spending bill

than a gun regulation

bill."

When the last vote was counted, Whitney Austin cried.

She thought about the September day four years ago when a man with a gun shot her 12 times; about the three people he killed and the other person he wounded in that 2028 mass shooting at a Cincinnait office building.

She thought about all the other mass shooting since that have elicited thoughts and peayers and outrage—but limite heightstive action.

We had seen such fallure before," and Austin, a Louisville matter and founder of Whitney/Storing, a nonprofit dedicated to preventing gen violence. "But there are a lot of things that got us to this mostness, and one of them in fallure.




## Rotarian in the Spotlight: Robert fink
