The Fund has a large endowment that provides funding for our service projects as well as grants both locally and abroad (through participation in Global Grants with other clubs and/or the international Rotary Foundation). Service projects and grant requests are submitted by our various committees each year by April 30, to our Service Projects & Grants Committee, for review and selection. The amount available to fund grants in any given year is calculated by a formula established in our Bylaws. The committee recommends a slate of projects/grants to the Rotary Fund Board. Once approved, it then goes to the Rotary Club Board for approval.

I am pleased to report that we will be awarding grants of almost \$150,000 to fund service projects this fiscal year!

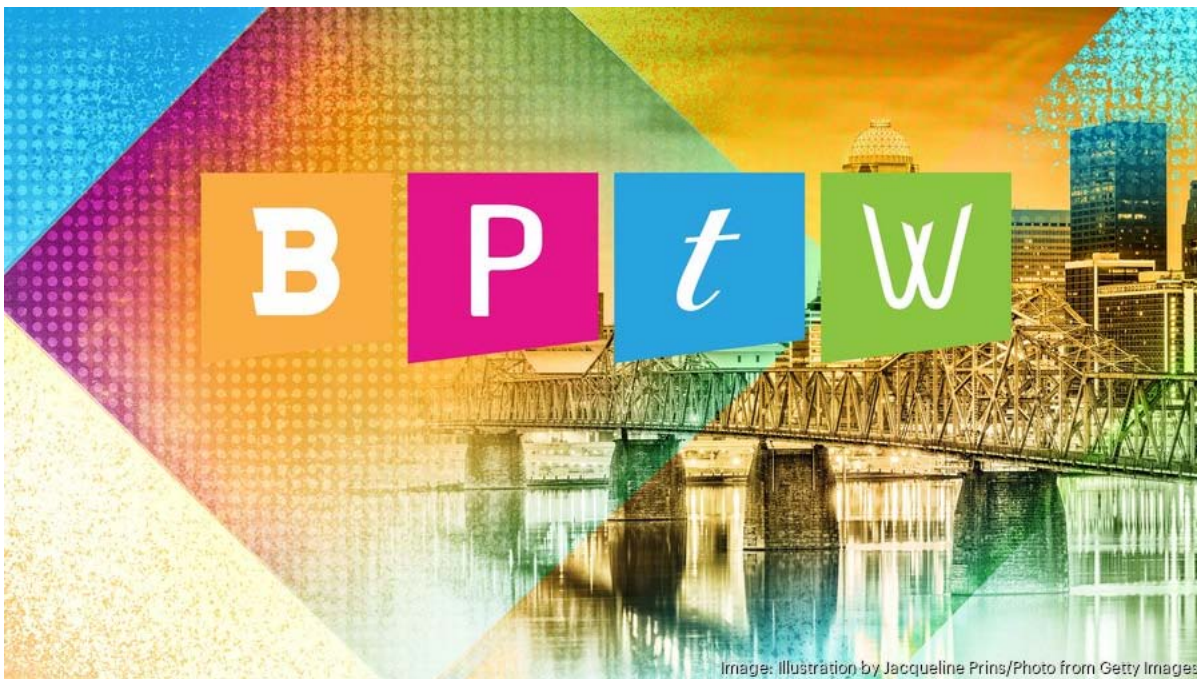
