
Next Week's Meeting - Michael Andrews



This short film by Elijah Yetter – Bowman tells the story of how one woman's persistence reached top elected officials to uncover firefighters' turnout gear and toxic foam contains Forever Chemicals/PFAS. PFAS which have been linked to a plethora of firefighters dying of cancer; in fact, "occupational cancer is the #1 killer of firefighters".

Clean water, air, soil, food, are important to human health but virtually ALL of us have PFAS Chemicals in our bodies - but firefighters' well-being and lives are especially in peril.

Save the Date!

Rotary Day at Bernheim Arboretum and Research Forest is scheduled for Saturday, October 14, 2023, from 11:00am – 2:00pm. Rotary members and their families are welcome to come out early or stay later to play, hike, fish, or just sit quietly in nature's beauty.

We will gather at the Education Center Gallery for orientation, as a site to start optional tours and to eat lunch.



Cost is \$15 per carload at the gate plus cost for a catered lunch (TBD).

Rotarian Dr. Mark Wourms will present a summary of Bernheim activities during lunch. We may also be able to interact with one of Bernheim's Artists in Residence over lunch or in the field.

Bernheim will have a solar-powered cart that seats 5 guests, and a 10 passenger van as a back-up for another touring option, particularly for those who are mobility challenged.

Optional Tours Include:

- Walking tour to see Forest Giants in a Giant Forest (45-60 minutes)
- Walking tour of the platinum LEED Visitor Center, Edible Garden, and Playcosystem* (30 minutes)
- Driving tour of Bernheim's Art in Nature (30 minutes)

*Note the Playcosystem – an outdoor, natural play environment can be a multiple-hour destination for children on its own. Additionally, any of the above can be cart, van, or driving tours with minor modifications.
