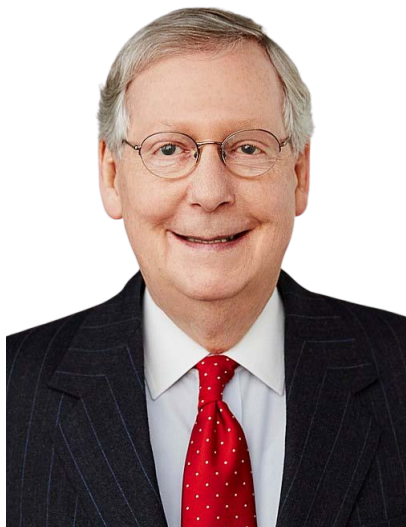

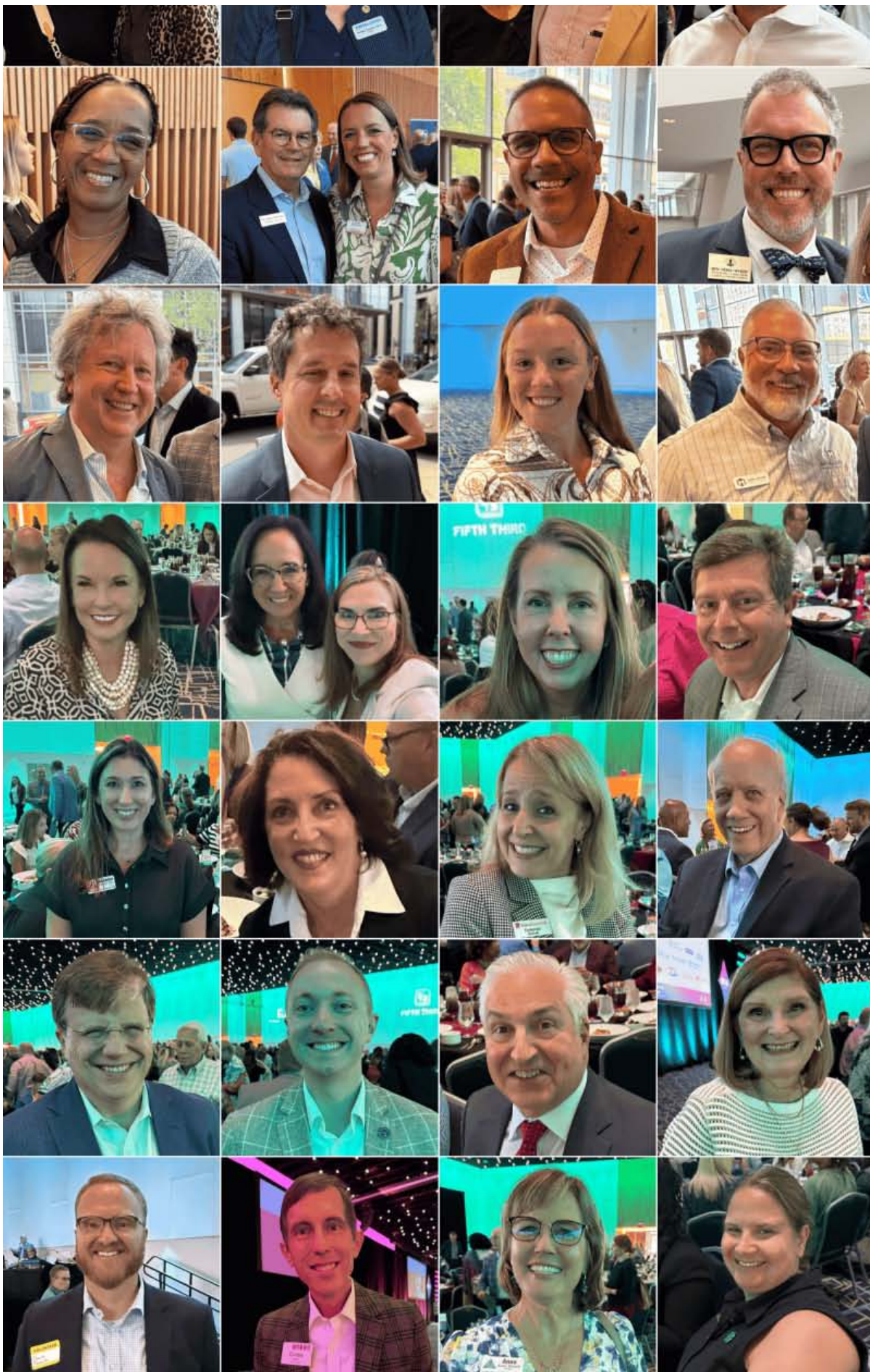

Our club, along with the United Nations Association of the USA - Kentucky Division, League of Women Voters of Louisville, Rotary District 6710, the Louisville Suburban Rotary Club and more, will honor [UN Day](#) (October 24), with a special event.

Kentucky made sexual extortion or [sextortion](#) a felony with the passage of [Senate Bill 73](#) earlier this year. The legislation includes threats to share explicit images or coercion into producing additional content and accounts for emerging concerns like AI-generated imagery and digital impersonation; it also strengthens Kentucky's ability to pursue justice for victims.

Our Club has been involved in anti-human trafficking efforts since 2017. Our most significant project to date involved supporting Catholic Charities of Louisville in developing a survivor Advisory Board as part of a pilot program with the Office for Victims of Crime. We provided grant funding and volunteer assistance with planning and conducting board meetings, as well as professional development presentations by Rotarians. Read more in this [Annual Report](#) where Rotary is featured prominently. The result was an award of a [\\$1.3 million in grants](#) from the Office for Victims of Crime (OVC) to further the work in anti-human trafficking. This is one example of how a relatively small investment can lead to a HUGE impact and changed lives.

Note: The United Nations marks its 80th year this month, with global leaders convening in New York City on September 9th for the [UN General Assembly](#). Eight decades after its establishment, the UN remains the only place on Earth where countries can gather to work through their differences and find common ground.
