



Edison "Lit The Way In 1866, Thomas Ediso moved to Louisville to work for the Western Electric for the Western Electric Company and 13 years later, "lit the way" to perfect the world's first incandescent light bulb on October 22, 1879. This was right after his Edison Electric Company became General Electric!
