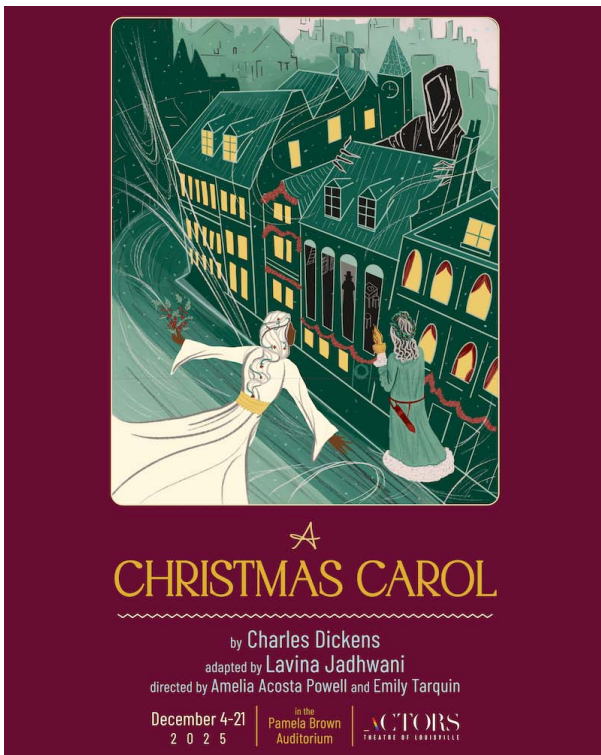

Operation Full Plate: Unite to Fight Hunger

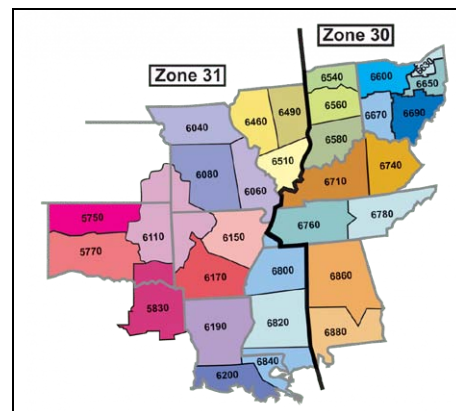
