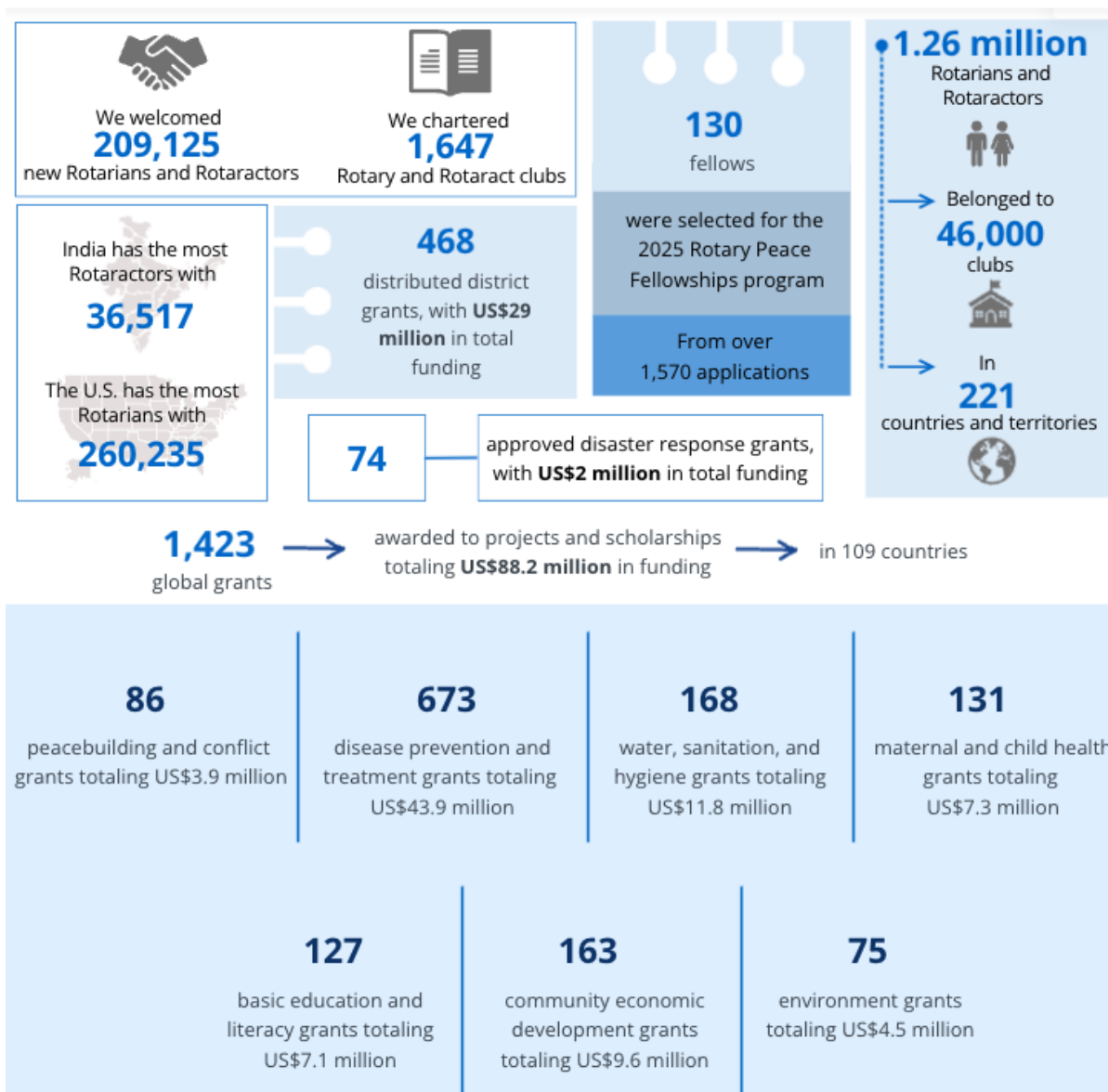

You can schedule a monthly, quarterly, or annual donation via credit card or bank account to begin helping the projects and programs you value most and empower Rotarians to change lives in communities around the world. At \$10 a month, you qualify for both *Every Rotarian Every Year* and Sustaining Donor status. At \$84 a month, you become a Paul Harris Society member, giving a total of \$1,000 per year. You are able to stop your donation at any time if your life circumstances were to change.

The District with the largest number of new Rotary Direct donors will receive \$5,000. The District with the largest percentage increase in enrollment will receive \$5,000.
