# **Garden Mission in Honduras**

Kevin & Cynthia Johnson founded The Garden Mission in Honduras in 2021. Nearly half of the population in rural Honduras suffers from malnutrition, with a staggering 23% under the age of 5 facing irreversible, lifelong effects due to lack of proper nutrition. The Garden Mission provides more than 1,200 nutritious meals monthly to children in these rural communities.







The Garden Mission's school scholarship program also provides impoverished children with the opportunity to receive an education and strive for a better tomorrow. Last year, the Punta Gorda Rotary Club Foundation provided a grant for new school desks for elementary school students at the Garden Mission.

#### **HELP/OK Poster for Hurricane Season**

The Punta Gorda Rotary Club partnered with the Punta Gorda Fire and Police departments to help residents prepare for future disasters with a new double-sided HELP/OK poster. In addition to providing an overview of disaster-related personal safety, the posters can serve as visual rescue requests for emergency services.





2024-25 Club President James Williams showed off the poster design, with a bright red "HELP" indicating a home in need of rescue and a cool green "OK" for those sheltering in place. Roughly 10,000 posters were distributed for use during the 2024 hurricane season throughout Punta Gorda and to some surrounding areas.

Fire Chief Holden Gibbs asked if we could provide additional posters for this year's hurricane season, and we delivered several boxes of them to the central fire station the last week in June. They will be available at Punta Gorda Fire Stations as well as at the public library.

Gibbs, as well as Police Chief Pam Davis, made clear that residents need to prepare now for the season by testing generators, buying new gas for them if necessary, and assembling other supplies to use in the event of a hurricane.

Residents can use the double-sided HELP/OK posters after a storm if they are having trouble with electricity or other needs. The posters can be placed on the front door or a window and are a clear message to neighbors as well as first responders who are out in the community providing help.

# **Rotary Supports Future Trades Professionals**

#### S4TL: Seminar for Tomorrow's Leaders

S4TL is a week-long, immersive leadership seminar for rising high school seniors, hosted each June at Florida Southern College in Lakeland, FL. Sponsored by Rotary clubs in Districts 6890, 6850, and 6960, it brings together up to 165 delegates to live on campus in dorms and experience college life from Father's Day through the following Saturday.

The students participate in lectures, motivational talks, "rap" sessions with Rotarians, group projects, and recreational activities — all rooted in Rotary values. Sessions cover leadership, integrity, effective communication, empowerment, decision-making, personal development, and service. Each day closes with the Rotary "4-Way Test"

A unique tiered leadership model allows students to return and grow each year:

- Yellow Shirts: first-year delegates;
- Red Shirts: rising college freshmen mentoring groups of Yellow Shirts (18 selected annually);
- White Shirts: third-year leaders who oversee program operations (10 selected); Baby Blue Shirts: two alumni who assist the Seminar Director after a gap year

The program is managed by a board of directors and supported by senior Rotarian staff, fostering leadership growth and continuity, from delegates to senior staff.
