Rotary Club of Olney Hosts CPR/AED Training, Expands Lifesaving Efforts for the Community

The Rotary Club of Olney, in partnership with Rescue One, hosted its annual CPR/AED training on Saturday, February 22, at Oakdale Church's Brigham Hall. This year's session included a certification course for the first time, with 28 local residents, from teenagers to seniors, learning critical lifesaving skills.

The Rotary Club has been committed to improving emergency preparedness in the community. In 2016, the club launched an initiative to install 24-hour accessible Automated External Defibrillators (AEDs) at key shopping centers in Greater Olney. So far, four AEDs have been mounted outside Giant Food, Harris Teeter, The Green Turtle, and the

Ashton Shopping Center, with four additional locations planned. Each AED installation costs \$2,000, covering the first year of maintenance, after which shopping center management assumes the ongoing upkeep.

Among the participants in Saturday's training were several local high school students. The three-hour session provided attendees with official certification cards upon completion. Read More

Highfield, a charter member of the club stated in an email. "The Rotary Club members, along with other service organizations and Westminster citizens, began to care for the cemetery.

"Rotary members cleaned up the flag court, donated a new flag pole, and stained the fences," he said.
