Texas Flooding Disaster Relief - Please Consider Donating

Dear Rotarians and Rotaractors,

Catastrophic flash floods swept across Central Texas, particularly devastating Kerr and Kendall counties. Some areas received over 11 inches of rain in just 3 hours, causing river levels to surge nearly 30 feet. The floods claimed 60+ lives, including children attending a summer camp, and a dozen of girls remain missing. Rescue operations are ongoing, with 250+ people evacuated by helicopter and boat. Entire communities have been left without power, clean water, or access to major roads, prompting a major disaster declaration and a coordinated response involving FEMA, state agencies, and relief organizations.

District 7620 Disaster Relief Committee is actively coordinating with Disaster Aid USA. Some volunteers from Texas and Louisiana are already on the ground to assess the damage and to make plans for deployment in the coming days and weeks. DAUSA actions will include the following.

- Debris Removal: Clearing fallen trees and wreckage to ensure safe access for residents and emergency services.
- Mucking and Gutting: Assisting homeowners in the removal of mud, water, and damaged materials from their homes to prevent further deterioration.
- Tarping Roofs: Providing temporary roofing solutions to protect homes from additional weather damage.

- Point of Distribution, Supplies: Setup and manage PODs for emergency supplies and aid.

In order for the Committee and the DAUSA to do this type of disaster relief work in the coming days and weeks, we encourage the Rotary clubs, and individual Rotarians and Rotaractors to consider donating money to DAUSA (a 501-c-3 organization, co-founded by PDG Bob Grill). Foundation and Grants Training Sessions Available On-line with Extended Deadline!

The incoming DRFC, Barton Goldenberg, has extended the deadline to complete the mandated **Foundation and Grants training for MOU qualification to 30 July**. Don't forget that required **MOU contributions (per capita, EREY and PHF) still must be completed by the end of the month, 30 June**, in line with the Rotary Year.

2025-26 District Grant Applications ROUND 2

Got a great idea for a community project? **Now's your chance to make it happen!** Due to your contributions 3 years ago, District 7620 will receive approximately \$100,000 in DDF for 2025-26 for small, impactful grants. While we are still evaluating awards in the first round of applications that ended 31 May, we have determined that we will have funds for a second round.

Commencing 1 July, the District is accepting new and updated applications for matching DDF for 2025-26 grants. Rotary Clubs are invited to submit applications for matching DDF for their projects. In addition, this is an opportunity to improve and update any applications that were not chosen in the first round.

All **applications and updates must be submitted in DACdb by 31 July**. The Grants Guide with its numerous supporting documents, found on the District website under the Foundation tab, details the requirements for District and Global Grants.

What Makes a Winning Application? The District Grants Committee will evaluate projects based on:

- **Project Objectives** – Clear need, strong community input, and alignment with Rotary's Focus Areas.
- **Project Design & Management** – Well-defined roles, responsibilities, and timelines, including *letters of commitment from all participating organizations*.
- **Impact & Sustainability** – Measurable outcomes, data-backed success, and long-term benefits.
- **Financial Feasibility** – A detailed budget with *supporting quotes or other documentation justifying the budget*.
