



This is a traditional 10 X 10 grid raffle with 100 squares available – once these SQUARES are sold – or December 20, 2024 whichever comes first, sales will close. Squares and Scores will be assigned randomly with assignments shared with participants via email prior to the Fiesta Bowl on December 31. Unsold squares are the property of the Columbia Town Center Rotary Club.

The winning squares will be based on the final score of each game. Final payout of prizes will be after the January 20 game.

On the GRID, the WINNING team is across the top, and the LOSING team down the vertical. A participant retains the same Square for all games. The last digit of the final score for each game determines the row and column.

You are invited to join a fun-filled two-week group tour to eastern India. In Feb 2026, we are organizing an India trip for interested Rotarians and Rotaractors. The details of the trip are provided below. See also the attached Flyer with pictures.

TRIP DETAILS:

Visiting three Rotary global grant project sites in Purulia, India. These projects were supported by 23 Rotary clubs of our district.

Attending the opening of a Rotary library, jointly operated by Purulia Rotary club and a local Trust.

- Going on a special tour of eastern India which includes:
 - Kolkata (Calcutta) and its impressive monuments (such as Victoria Memorial)
 - Sundarbans Tiger Reserve (home of Royal Bengal Tigers), and
 - Darjeeling tea gardens in the slopes of the Himalayan Range

Expected cost for this fun-filled trip is \$2,500/person, including air fare. Purulia Rotary club will appreciate any donation toward their library project.

We had organized a similar group tour in 2020, and it was a grand success. Six Rotarians had joined in to visit northern India at that time.

Early decision from your part by March/April will help us plan the trip better.



We are delighted to inform fellow Rotarians about the Dictionary Project 2025 delivery season and would LOVE to have you join us in delivering dictionaries to EVERY Third-grader in the DC Public School System.

We NEED your help!!

We are excited to invite you to join us for the Club's signature project with an exceptional level of member participation since 2005. For those of you that have delivered in the past, thank you. We would like to recruit new Co-Chairs for this project too!

Please read the section below for details on signing up for the Dictionary Project. Also, we have included supporting materials that will assist you on your journey.

Assignment list – Use <u>Sign Up Genius</u> to sign up for the school of your choice based on availability. Please pick (preferably) two schools. There are two slots available per school. Click the light blue "sign up" button to sign up for a school sign-ups are on a first come, first serve basis.

Delivery Instructions - The delivery instructions are available on the Club's Sign Up Genius site.

Map of Schools – All the DC Public Schools have been pinned on Google Maps. You may access this map on Sign Up Genius. This is used as a visual tool to see where schools are in relation to one another or to your residence/ work.

Bookmarks – Please do not forget to take bookmarks to handout with the dictionaries. The bookmarks have been placed in brown paper bags in increments of 20. Each bag is labeled with a "20" on the outside of it. These bookmarks are a great way to explain the many ways the dictionaries can be used, and they get the word out about our club. And, of course, students can use them to mark their places in the dictionary.

List of Schools – The list of schools is available on the <u>Sign Up Genius</u> site. The list was recently updated and includes the school's address and phone number.

Partnering Up – We recommend you partner with a friend, a family member, or another Rotary member to share the experience and make it more fun!

Storage Unit – We have a new storage unit. The storage facility is still located at Cube Smart (175 R St. NE) but our new unit is now on the 2^{nd} floor. The storage unit details are listed in the delivery instructions document.
