Donations to the PolioPlus Society are tax-deductible and qualify for Paul Harris Recognition credit. Rotarians may make a one-time donation of \$100 or more or a recurring monthly donation of \$10. PolioPlus Society members will be presented with a special pin and a certificate. It is truly a win-win situation: you, the Club, and Rotary International all benefit.

## Rotary Club of Rockville Looking for Sponsors for Rockville 2025 10K/5K Event

November 2, 2025 at 8:30 am, the longest continuous road race in Montgomery County will kick off and we are in charge of getting sponsors for this run.

It is a wonderful community gathering. Every dollar that we generate for this fundraiser is part of the pot of money that we give away in 2026. So think about who can sponsor this and how it can help your favorite charity that we give money to.

We co-host every year with the City of Rockville and the Montgomery County Road Runners. There will be about 1500 runners and about 3000-5000 spectators.

If you have a prospective sponsor in mind but do not know how to approach them, Doug, Denise or Andrew can help. Our goal this year is 15,000. Last year we raised around 12,000.

What does your Sponsorship do? The annual Rockville Rotary Foundation has raised over 1.5 million dollars since it began in 1980. And all of it has benefited citizens of Rockville and charities around the world.

Almost 1800 runners annually participate in this 5/10K race through Rockville neighborhoods. All funds raised each year are divided between the 501(c)(3) Rockville Rotary Foundation and the Rockville Recreation Fund. The Rockville Recreation Fund annually provides hundreds of low income children and families with funding to participate in summer camps, sports leagues, after-school day-care, teen programs and community center classes and activities. The Rockville Rotary Foundation supports local homeless shelters, food programs, needy families, Scouting organizations, historic projects, Rotary International's Polio Eradication Initiative, as well as many health and education programs in the U.S., India, Kenya and Mexico.
