Gather at the Peace Pole Sept 21

On May 24th, 2025, the Rotary Club of Gaithersburg, with the City of Gaithersburg, became the first in our district to plant a Peace Pole. This tall, white bar is inscribed with the words, "May peace prevail on earth," in eight languages. More than 250,000 peace poles stand tall in nearly every country in the world.

On International Peace Day, September 21st, at 9:00 a.m., club members will gather informally at the pole. There will be no music, no speeches, and only limited refreshments. The idea is simply to exchange ideas about peace, both locally and in the world as a whole.

Rotarians and members of the public are invited to attend the event, in Bohrer Park, at 506 South Frederick Avenue in Gaithersburg, MD.



Call for Nominations: 2026 Rotary Global Grant Scholarship

It's time to identify and nominate outstanding candidates for the 2026 Rotary Global Grant Scholarship! With the power of your District Designated Funds (DDF) and Rotary International's matching funds, our District can award up to \$30,000 to a candidate pursuing graduate studies in one of Rotary's Areas of Focus outside the United States.

What Clubs Need to Do

September–December: Identify, interview, and endorse qualified candidates.

December 31: Deadline to submit club endorsements online to the District Global Grants Scholarship Committee using the following link - Club Endorsement.

February–March: District finalist interviews.

March–April: District selection of scholar(s).

May–June: District submits Global Grant application and partners candidate with a host Rotary club in the destination country.

August: Scholarship funds become available; most scholars begin studies.

Key Eligibility Rules (Remember 1–2–3!) Graduate studies only (no undergraduate programs).
Outside the United States.

Degree must align with one of Rotary's Areas of Focus.

Together, let's Unite for Good by launching a scholar who will create measurable, sustainable change in the world!

Get Your Feet Wet ... Try a Rotary Grant even if not MOU Qualified!

The District Governor (DG) and District Rotary Foundation Chair (DRFC) are encouraging all clubs to experience the benefits of Rotary grants. As a special, one-time opportunity, every Rotary club in our District—whether MOU qualified or not—may apply for up to \$1,000 in 2:1 matching District Designated Funds (DDF) to support a local project.

Key Parameters:

- Open to clubs that have not received District DDF this year (as lead or contributing club)
- Available regardless of MOU compliance
- Requires a 2:1 match (example: \$1,000 DDF with \$500 club contribution)
- Local projects only
- Maximum of \$1,000 per grant

Must meet Rotary International and District requirements, including:

- o At least one applicant has completed grants training (video available on the District website under Foundation ? Grants)
- o Submitted in DACdb
- o Balanced budget with supporting quotes
- o Letters of commitment from cooperating partners
- o Project completed and Final Report to be submitted by May 15 Compliant applications will be awarded on a first-come, first-served basis until the available \$12,000 in DDF is allocated.



Matching funds multiply your contributions, bring projects to life, and create opportunities for members to engage more deeply while showcasing Rotary's reach.
