Please note that the District Executive Secretary will be out of the office until June 2nd!

Special Note to Incoming Club Officers! Now is the time to verify this information in "My Rotary" and in DACdb...

- The names of your 2025-26 club officers as well as their contact details, such as mailing addresses, email addresses, and phone and fax numbers.
- Your club's meeting details: place, address, day, and time.
- Your club's contact information: a permanent phone number and, if you have them, a permanent email address and mailing address where all club officers can receive mail, as well as your club website.

If you have any trouble verifying and updating this information, please let me know!

Should your club file a 990 EZ?

If a club's gross receipts is less than \$50,000, the Club can file the postcard which is Form 990-N.

If a club's gross receipts is more than \$50,000 but less than \$200,000, the Club can file Form 990-EZ.

If a club's gross receipts is more than \$200,000, it must file Form 990.

What is the deadline for filing?


Form 990, 990-EZ, and 990-PF are due on the 15th day of the 5th month after the end of the

organization's accounting period.

- For organizations following a calendar year, the due date is May 15th.
- The due date for Form 990-N cannot be extended, but there is no penalty for submitting it late (unless it's the third consecutive year of not filing).




