Grant Literacy Kenya

Program Speakers: Doctor Ralph Stroup, Mary Anne Stroup and Hope Looney - North Branford Rotary Club spoke on "Grant Literacy Kenya"

The Rotary Club of North Branford has been involved with this organization since 2014. This was a fantastic presentation, and we learned a great deal about how a literacy program is a

bridge from misery to hope in a community. We learned that literacy is a tool for daily life in a modern society and that it is a building block to create economic development and to help fight poverty.

- There is still a very dominant tribal system in this area of Kenya. Here there are seven villages with a population of 22,000 people.
- They are pastoral communities, and this means that the men are in charge
- There were great problems that developed because of the Covid outbreak. There have been increases in school dropouts, teen pregnancies and "early" marriages, often arranged by the woman's family more as a business deal than a romance.

The Rotary Club of North Branford is looking for financial help from The Rotary Club of Madison and from other clubs in our and other districts to help them both continue and expand this good work.
