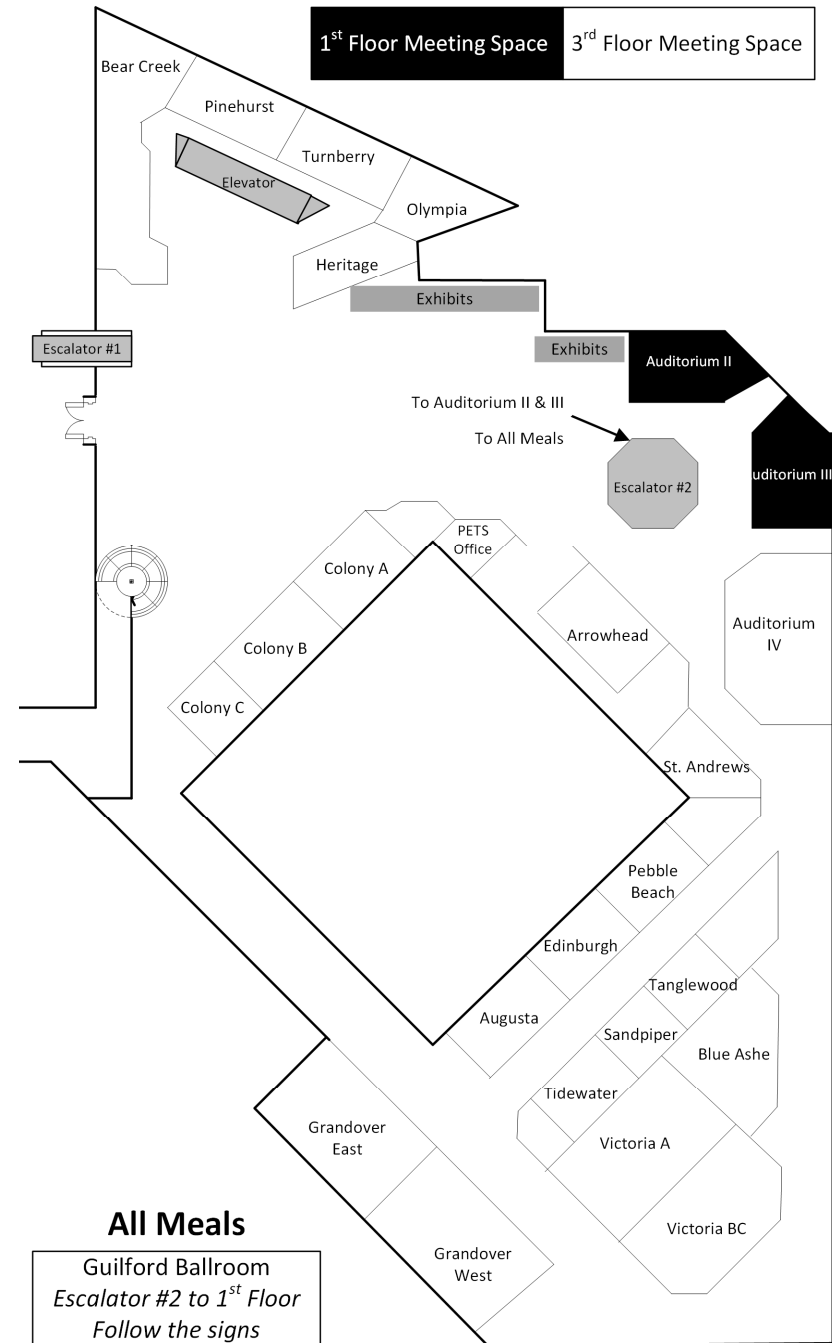

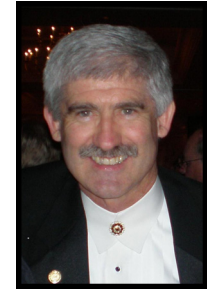
Bill Shillito, Governor 2007-2008, District 7670 Conover, NC

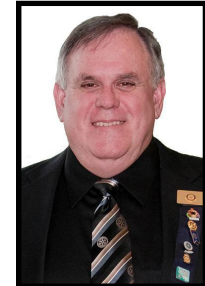
Lewis Hoggard, Governor 2021-2022, District 7720

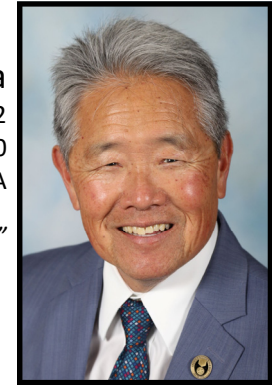
