## The Impact of the Rotary Friendship Exchange From Butoolo Health Center near Kampala, Uganda

Dear All,

I hope this email finds you well.

I would like to share an update from Butoolo regarding the ongoing impact of your generous support. My apologies that this comes a little later than expected—I was away on leave. It has not taken long for the neonatal unit to be put to critical use. On 20th November, a baby was born in severe distress with birth asphyxia. The medical team worked tirelessly for two hours to resuscitate the baby using the radiant warmer and oxygen therapy. By around 8:00 p.m., the baby was able to breathe on her own.

Although fairly stable, the baby and mother were referred to Gombe Hospital due to the uncertainty of stable electricity power supply at Butoolo Health Centre. The hospital in-charge followed up the next morning and found a very happy mother and the baby in good condition and able to breastfeed. We are truly grateful for this positive outcome. They have since been discharged, and we have requested the in-charge to continue following up and update us on the baby's progress.

We have also settled the payment for the neonatal unit supplier.

Additionally, we are in the process of installing a backup solar power system for the maternity unit to ensure readiness for future emergencies. This work is being carried out under an existing MOU between the district leadership and Davis & Shirliff, which supports clubs implementing water and solar projects. An assessment has already been completed, and the cost will be shared 50/50 between the company and the club. We have paid our portion and are now awaiting installation.
