## Weekly Member Profile

### Daivid Dalton

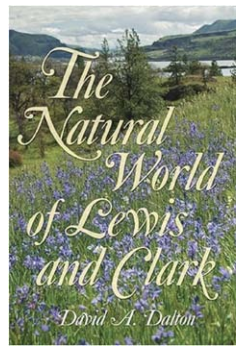
Even though David grew up in North Carolina, he has been an

Oregonian since 1982. He completed his undergraduate degree at



Duke University in 1973 studying botany. After a few wandering years he enrolled at Oregon State University where he also studied botany earning a M.S. and PhD (1986). The fact that Corvallis was close to mountains, rivers, and old growth forests was a significant factor in his decision to attend OSU. After OSU, David spent a year as a postdoctoral fellow with the

U.S. Department of Agriculture in Raleigh. Then, he landed his dream job as a faculty member at Portland's Reed College, teaching Biology for 32 years, supervising 110 senior thesis projects, and receiving over \$1.1 million in federal research grants. More than half of his students went on to earn a Ph.D. in life sciences after graduation. His courses included Intro Bio, Plant Physiology, Plant Communities of the PW, the Biological Legacy of Lewis and Clark and others.



David is especially proud of his book: *The Natural World of Lewis and Clark*. He did research on a number of subjects mostly dealing with the role of vitamin C in promoting nitrogen fixation (the ability of some plants to take nitrogen from the air and convert it to fertilizer.) He has traveled all over the world to present his findings (London, Sydney, Cancun, Cape Town, and elsewhere).

He retired from Reed College in 2020 and moved along with his wife and life partner, Jan, to their home near Terrebonne which he has maintained since 1997 as a weekend, summer home and finally their retirement base. They have 24 acres on the banks of the Deschutes River with awesome mountain views. Jan has continued to work from home as a cardiac device specialist. They have two wonderful kids (Abigail and Andy) from a previous marriage with both living in Pennsylvania, along with 3 grandchildren. Jan has a large family in western Oregon (3 kids, 7 grandkids) all adopted into their inner circle, sharing lots of good times together despite the travel times. Outdoor adventures have been a huge part of David's life. Most particularly, mountain climbing and whitewater rafting. He has climbed all the mountains (with 2 exceptions) between Mt. Baker (in

N. WA) and Mt. Shasta in N. CA. He climbed South Sister with his son at age 5 making the front page of the Corvallis Gazette Times. Throw in a few other peaks in Alaska also. David have rafted all the rivers in Oregon and many elsewhere in the West. (Throw in one in Alaska – the Tatshenshini). David claims that age has slowed him down a lot but he did manage to tackle the Grande Ronde River recently with help from old river pards. He used to mountain and road bike a bit but have aged out, but still enjoys getting outside to hike when he can.

Dogs have been a very important part of his life. As an adult, he has always had 2 golden retrievers. Currently, they have a puppy English cream golden retriever (Sage) and an older standard golden retriever (Timber). Many of his goldens used to frequently raft with him, but after a bad run-in with a rattlesnake on the Grande Ronde (Max the dog survived), he'll no longer take them on rafting expeditions. Nowadays, they still do a lot of hiking together.
