Completes Second Water Project in Tanzania

The Jacksonville-Applegate Rotary Club recently renovated a well for several thousand residents of Longido, Tanzania in the Lake Natron area near the Serengeti Plain. After identifying a well which had been drilled and tested for contaminants, but was not functioning, the Club provided funding to build a platform, put in tanks, add piping and holding tanks, and create a public spigot. The Club insisted that the project be sustainable. Therefore, a solar array is used to power the pump, so the project is not dependent on a source of fuel. Also, the pumping operation is located away from the spigot, is fenced, and is guarded by the Government in order to keep it safe from people and animals. The Masai who are benefitting from this project have invited the Club to visit next May in order to celebrate this life-giving project. Funds from the grant helped the Curry County Library Foundation purchase enough Lego Robotics kits to support workshops for twenty participants. The grant also allowed the Library Foundation to hire an instructor to teach three four-day workshops (one at the library in Brookings, one at the library in Gold Beach, and one at the library in Port Orford). In total, the program served 60 children between the ages of 6 and 13, and provided all participants with a fun environment to learn the basics of computer programming. Curry County Library Foundation plans to continue offering this program as a part of its regular youth summer programs.

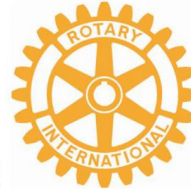
