District Governor Selection for 2019-2020 Begins with a Call for Candidate Nominations

In accordance with District 5110 Policy Manual Article VII Section 1:

"... the President of any Club wishing to place the name of one of its members in nomination for District Governor Nominee Designate shall file with all members of the Nominating Committee, the District Governor, the District Governor Elect and the District Governor Nominee a Resolution of the Club, adopted at a regular meeting of the Club, and properly certified by the Club secretary, naming such candidate and certifying that the candidate resides within the boundaries of District 5110 and meets the qualifications for District Governor Nominee as provided in Rotary International By-Laws Article 15.070 together with supplemental information limited to a picture of the candidate and biographic sketch of his/her personal and Rotary background. The District Governor shall, not later than September 15th of each year, or cause to be issued in the name of the Nominating Committee, an announcement inviting any club which desires to do so to suggest a candidate for District Governor Nominee Designate and will furnish the names and mailing addresses to which suggestions shall be sent."

All nominations are due no later than September 16, 2016. Applicants will be invited to attend the Foundation Rendezvous Dinner on September 30th in Corvallis and asked to give a 5-minute talk on "The Value of the Rotary Foundation" at that dinner. The District 5110 Nominations Committee will meet after the Foundation Seminar on October 1st to confer about candidates nominated.

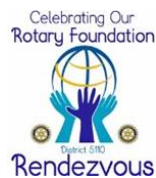

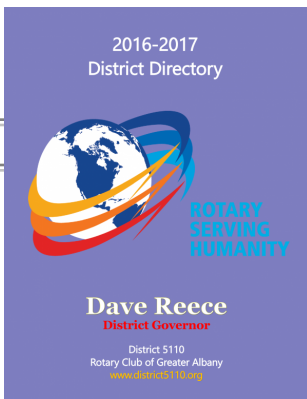

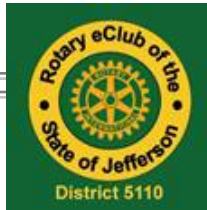

Guatemala Service Trip

Hands On – Volunteer Trip 2016





Medford Rogue Club and Woodland Charity invites you to participate in the International Volunteer Trips to Guatemala from November 1 to 8, 2016.

- Volunteers will unify efforts with local leaders and families of Guatemala to implement the **Access to Education, Health and Safe Drinking Water Program**.
 - Every month Woodland welcomes volunteers such as Family Physicians, Nurses, Dentist, Lab Technicians, Med Students, Rotarians, Engineers, Teachers, Social Workers, Corporate teams and Non- Medical volunteers.
- Duration and cost of the trip:
 - Each team needs a minimum of 5 individuals registered.
 - The cost for 7 days (1 week) is \$775 to Guatemala per person. (includes in-country expenses: meals, lodging, ground transportation, translators, program administration expenses and evacuation insurance)
 - Bi-lingual volunteers are encouraged to participate.
- Trip activities include:
 - Installing water filters, cooking stoves, beds, and latrines.
 - Medical and dental checkups. Nutrition training.
 - Volunteer work at the community farm/garden
 - Sewing machine training, English/computer classes and other activities at the school or in the community.

Volunteers are responsible for purchasing their own roundtrip airplane ticket from the U.S. to Guatemala.
