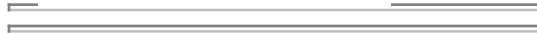

Is your club welcoming? Is there someone at the front to greet guests?

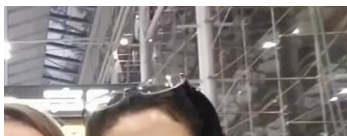
Does someone take the guest and help them find someone they know?

Completes Second Water Project in Tanzania

The Jacksonville-Applegate Rotary Club recently renovated a well for several thousand residents of Longido, Tanzania in the Lake Natron area near the Serengeti Plain. After identifying a well which had been drilled and tested for contaminants, but was not functioning, the Club provided funding to build a platform, put in tanks, add piping and holding tanks, and create a public spigot. The Club insisted that the project be sustainable. Therefore, a solar array is used to power the pump, so the project is not dependent on a source of fuel. Also, the pumping operation is located away from the spigot, is fenced, and is guarded by the Government in order to keep it safe from people and animals. The Masai who are benefitting from this project have invited the Club to visit next May in order to celebrate this life-giving project. 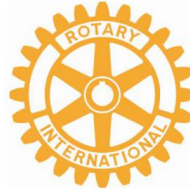

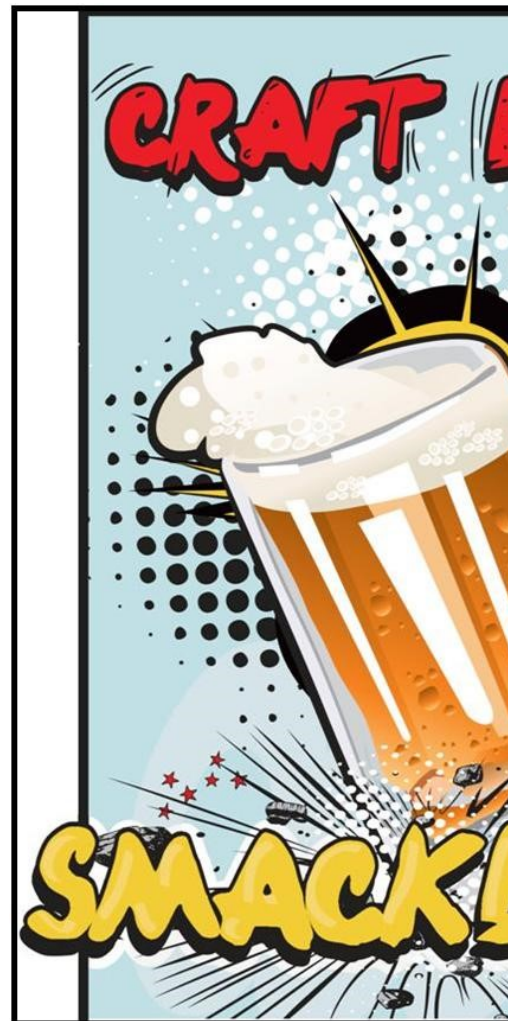

I the lead agency for several years as the balloons alternated their base between Etna in Montague. A decision to privatize was made by the Board of Supervisors, and after we said “yes”. We knew nothing about the complexities of sponsoring a successful event. We were fast learners and had great mentors.

The festival is a yearly event in Montague and draws crowds from the Western US. It is free to the public, spotlights the beauty of Siskiyou County, and raises money for community projects. This annual September event can be a “hands on” experience for those who want to fly. We love volunteers!

Volunteers and service organizations that participate in the event – YMCA, Elks, Rotary, and the Chamber of Commerce of Montague, Scott Valley, and Yreka, Yreka High School, Montague Elementary School, and others raise money for their own community projects. In addition, their service allows them to fund infrastructure and expansion projects in 2017 – the Siskiyou Family YMCA and the Chamber of Commerce give back to community the profits from this Balloon Fair, and these youth
