District Governor Selection for 2019-2020 Begins with a Call for Candidate Nomination Submittals

In accordance with District 5110 Policy Manual Article VII Section 1:

"... the President of any Club wishing to place the name of one of its members in nomination for District Governor Nominee Designate shall file with all members of the Nominating Committee, the District Governor, the District Governor Elect and the District Governor Nominee a Resolution of the Club, adopted at a regular meeting of the Club, and properly certified by the Club secretary, naming such candidate and certifying that the candidate resides within the boundaries of District 5110 and meets the qualifications for District Governor Nominee as provided in Rotary International By-Laws Article 15.070 together with supplemental information limited to a picture of the candidate and biographic sketch of his/her personal and Rotary background. The District Governor shall, not later than September 15, issue, or cause to be issued in the name of the Nominating Committee, an announcement inviting any club which desires to do so to suggest a candidate for District Governor Nominee Designate and will furnish the names and mailing addresses to which suggestions shall be sent."



All nominations are due no later than September 16, 2016. Applicants will be invited to attend the Foundation Rendezvous Dinner on September 30th in Corvallis and asked to give a 5-minute talk on "The Value of the Rotary Foundation" at that dinner. The D5110 Nominations Committee will meet after the Foundation Seminar on October 1st to confer about candidates nominated.

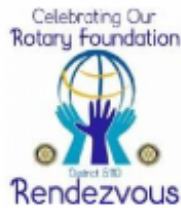

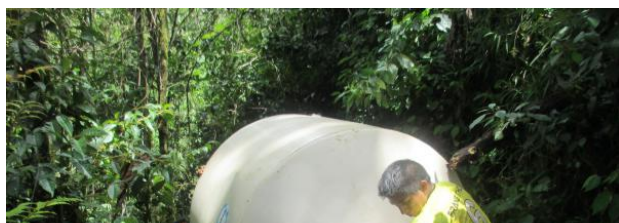

Child Nutrition Project in Guatemala

Three 100-lb. rain water collection tanks supplied by a District 5110 grant in partnership with the Grants Pass, Rogue Gateway, Illinois Valley, and Rogue Valley Rotary Clubs are painstakingly hauled



two kilometers over a rocky foot path of a steep mountainside in northwest Guatemala. The tanks are part of a Child Nutrition project that teaches Mayan villagers how to grow and harvest the highly nutritious amaranth plant for

consumption by malnourished youngsters. Guatemala has the highest child malnutrition rate in Latin America and the fourth highest in the world, a condition that permanently limits body and brain development. Teaching the production of amaranth is specifically aimed at increasing protein and other vitamins and minerals currently deficit in the Mayan diet.

Many times over the last ten years you may have heard us mention Project Amigo located in Cofradia de Suchitlan, Mexico, a small community of about 1500 people. Project Amigo was started by two Rotarians 30 years ago, and the project is still going strong. After being involved in work weeks in 2007 and 2008, we headed down there for a five-month stint in 2008-2009 doing volunteer work for them. We have now made plans to attend another work week (November 12-19) which is entitled Community



and Culture. This work week focuses on literacy and taking libraries to under-served areas.

It would really be fun if some of you could join us. There is room for 23 participants. The requested donation of \$1,200 per person includes double-occupancy accommodations, all meals, pick-up and return airport transport, local transportation, entertainment and cultural activities, snacks and non-alcoholic beverages. Add \$125 for a single room. The donation does not include transportation between the U.S. and Guadalajara or Manzanillo, long-distance telephone calls or alcoholic beverages. Please visit their

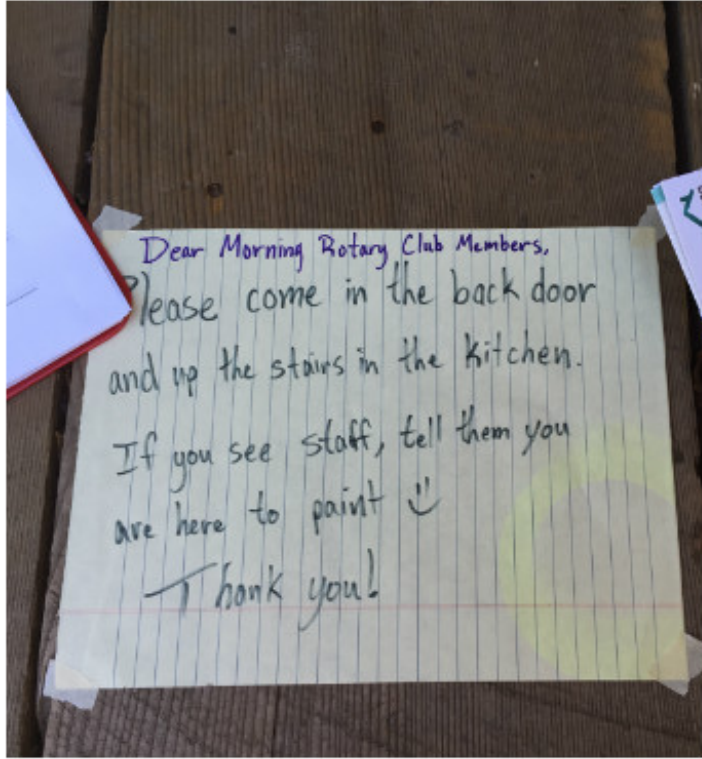

As a small and intimate Rotary club, resources are tight. While many members have individual passions for local projects, the shot-gun approach grew weary for 11 club members with a big heart towards service. "During a cathartic meeting late last fall, members quickly rallied around the idea of adopting a local non-profit organization," said past President, Pat Hazleton. "We invited a number of people to visit with us over the course of the winter and landed on Jackson Street Youth Shelter," added Hazleton. On August 11 and 12, seven club members and one spouse tackled part one of a painting job, getting four bedrooms painted in two days. Rotarians honored restraints by the shelter, and volunteer coordinator Aaron saw the workforce potential he had at his disposal. Laying the foundation for a good partnership, Corvallis Morning Rotarians felt the satisfaction of a job well done knowing they improved living situations for at-risk youth. Rotarians will be back hard at work come January 2017 when they tackle with brushes and rollers the daily living area at Jackson Street Youth Shelter.
